

COX STRONG IN G. O. P. CENTER OF CINCINNATI

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Cincinnati, Ohio, Oct. 25.—Governor Cox's chances of carrying Ohio have seemed to depend largely on what he can do in such Republican strongholds as Hamilton county, which includes in its boundaries the city of Cincinnati. Every time Cox has run for office in Ohio, he has either cut down the Republican majority or carried the county.

If Governor Cox can come down to Hamilton county with a lead of 35,000 to 40,000 he would still be able to carry Ohio by a majority of from 10,000 to 15,000. That's Democratic optimism in Southern Ohio. Workers whose morale must be kept up and leaders whose hopes are never dashed to the ground till the last vote is counted, firmly believe the reduction of the Harding majority in Hamilton county will mean a Cox victory in the state.

The governor is due to speak here this week and the local Democrats who have been stimulated by the noticeable drift to Cox in the last few days, think the effect of the visit will be to cut down further the Harding majority in Hamilton county.

COX GAINS STRENGTH
There is no denying the steady growth of Democratic strength ever since Senator Harding made his speech at Des Moines, which was interpreted as a rejection of the present League of Nations. One of the newspapers here printed 100,000 copies of the covenant for free distribution and the supply was quickly exhausted. The Democrats who were inclined to scoff at the League of Nations issue as a vote-getting proposition admit that they should have become enthusiastic about it earlier in the game. They now see its possibilities. They insist that a mere reading of the covenant has made votes simply because the text of the document refutes many of the arguments and misrepresentations that have been made by opponents of the pact.

ADmits DAVIS' WEAKNESS
The Republicans themselves admit that their gubernatorial candidate, Harry Davis, is losing strength and that this may affect adversely the congressional ticket which is on the same ballot, but they do not agree that Cox is benefitting particularly by that phase of the situation. Hamilton county, which helped elect Cox governor of Ohio, will go Republican. If the remainder of the state gives Cox a lead, he could win without Hamilton county. To determine how Ohio will cast her electoral vote, the political wayfarer must go to Northern Ohio.

**Nursery Fund Drive
Is Termed Worthy;
\$25,000 Is Sought**

The "finish the building" campaign of Albertina Kerr nursery home finds much encouragement at the outset, according

to Mrs. R. E. Bondurant, campaign chairman, who is confident that public generosity will respond to the efforts of the drive organization and speedily contribute the \$25,000 required to complete the new home at East Twenty-second street and Sandy boulevard. Headquarters are at 409 Artisans building.

"Every dollar received will be applied directly and solely to the building fund," declared Mrs. Bondurant. "Those who give may do so with the assurance that the babies will receive 100 per cent value of the gift."

Of the original building fund of \$75,000 not a cent remains. Increased building costs largely exceed the estimates and winter is upon the babies without their new quarters being ready. The campaign is to provide money for immediate completion of the home, which will be ready by January 1 if the drive is successful.

BRITAIN NOT TO HALT IMPRESSIVE M'SWINEY BURIAL

London, Oct. 25.—(U. P.)—Impressive funeral honors will be accorded Terence MacSwiney, who began life as a clerk and died in a spectacular manner for Ireland.

The home office promised today there will be no interference with plans of Irish leaders who announced MacSwiney's body will lie in state in St. George's cathedral, to be carried later in solemn procession to entrain for the journey to an Irish grave. Officials said the only restriction on the funeral services will be that no Sinn Féin firing squad will be permitted to officiate at the grave. One of MacSwiney's last requests was that the funeral orations be pronounced in Gaelic. There was no official opposition to that.

The deputy lord mayor of Cork arrived here today with a bodyguard of 50 Sinn Féiners and representatives of many Irish societies. It was reported that Dail Eireann, the Irish parliament, may attend the funeral in a body.

After the inquest, expected to be concluded Wednesday morning, MacSwiney's body will be taken to St. Georges cathedral. It will lie in state under guard of his followers until 11 a. m. Thursday. At that hour solemn high mass will be celebrated by Bishop Mannix and Bishop Cotter of Portland.

Later in the afternoon a funeral procession will be formed to pass through many of the principal streets, en route to a railway station.
