### ACID IS USED IN ALTERING STAMPS, WITNESS BELIEVES

Opening arguments of the six attorneys in the War Saving Stamp case were completed in the federal court this morning and four witnesses were put on the stand.

E. D. Myers of the Scio State Bank told of the robbery of the institution on March 3, 1920, and gave the names of bank customers who had lost stamps and Liberty bonds.

Miss Daisy Buckner, postmistress at Scio, said 50 persons had filed claims with her to recover their money for the stamps stolen. She explained that the government redeemed registered stamps attached to certificates and that the registration number used at Scio was 60819.

Secret Service Agent Joseph Walters told the jury he had found 175 stamps, some of which bore the number 60819, in the room of Fred Peterson, 15 Pacific hotel. Walters explained that an effort had been made to erase the registration numbers. He produced enlarged photographs of stamps attached to the certificates, which brought out the registration numbers. The peculiar odors attached to the stamps and the absence of glue on the back of those found in Peterson's room was also mentioned. Walters said the odor indicated that the acid was used to remove the registration numbers.

Chief Special Agent W. R. Bryon was called just before the noon hour and told of conversations with two of the defendants, William Brenner and Angelo Rossi. He referred to a telegram sent by Rossi to a man named Earl Lee, stating "the goods are all rusty." Bryon said this wire was the cause for the government investigation. Lee is said to be an ex-convict. Bryon said this wire was sent after Police Inspector Robert La Salle had found the stamps to be altered and came back on Brenner and Rossi for his money.

### Kiwanis Tourists Laud Hospitality Received on Trip

Eastern Oregon hospitality received unstinted praise from nine members of the Kiwanis club at the weekly luncheon Tuesday noon at the Hotel Benson, in their reports on the Portland trade excursion into that territory. The wonderful possibilities of that vast region were carefully explained.

For tying a barbed wire around the neck of a cow which he owned, L. H. Morgan, principal of the Sellwood school, was fined \$10 and costs by Justice Perry at Milwaukie Tuesday afternoon. Morgan was granted a jury trial at his own request and found guilty of the charge of cruelty to animals.

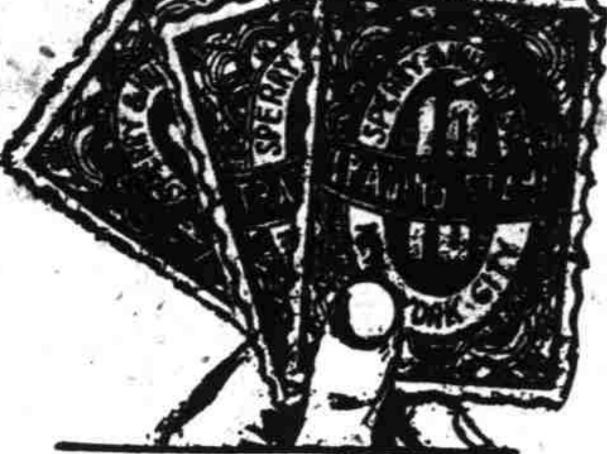

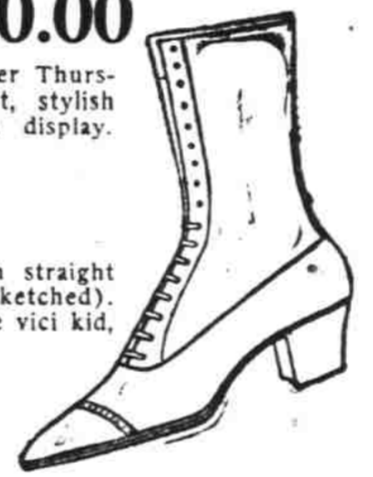
