

## EGGS RULING HIGH AND BUTTER DOWN

Fresh eggs are about as scarce as ever known in this section and prices are again higher, despite the lower prices in the East. However, prices here at retail are far below what the wholesalers are asking in the East.

Butter prices continue to be shaded and consumers are expected to get their requirements at lower figures.

Cheese is cheap, and it's of unusually good quality at this time.

Chickens are again higher and indications point to still higher prices.

Pork is again cheaper at wholesale and retailers are expected to follow the decline.

Cranberries will be advanced somewhat during the coming week. At the higher prices consumers are expected to utilize other fruit.

Next week in apple week and special prices will be named in the stores. Buying by the box is cheapest.

The following prices ruled generally in retail shops for good quality. Some values are fractionally higher, and inferior stuff fractionally lower.

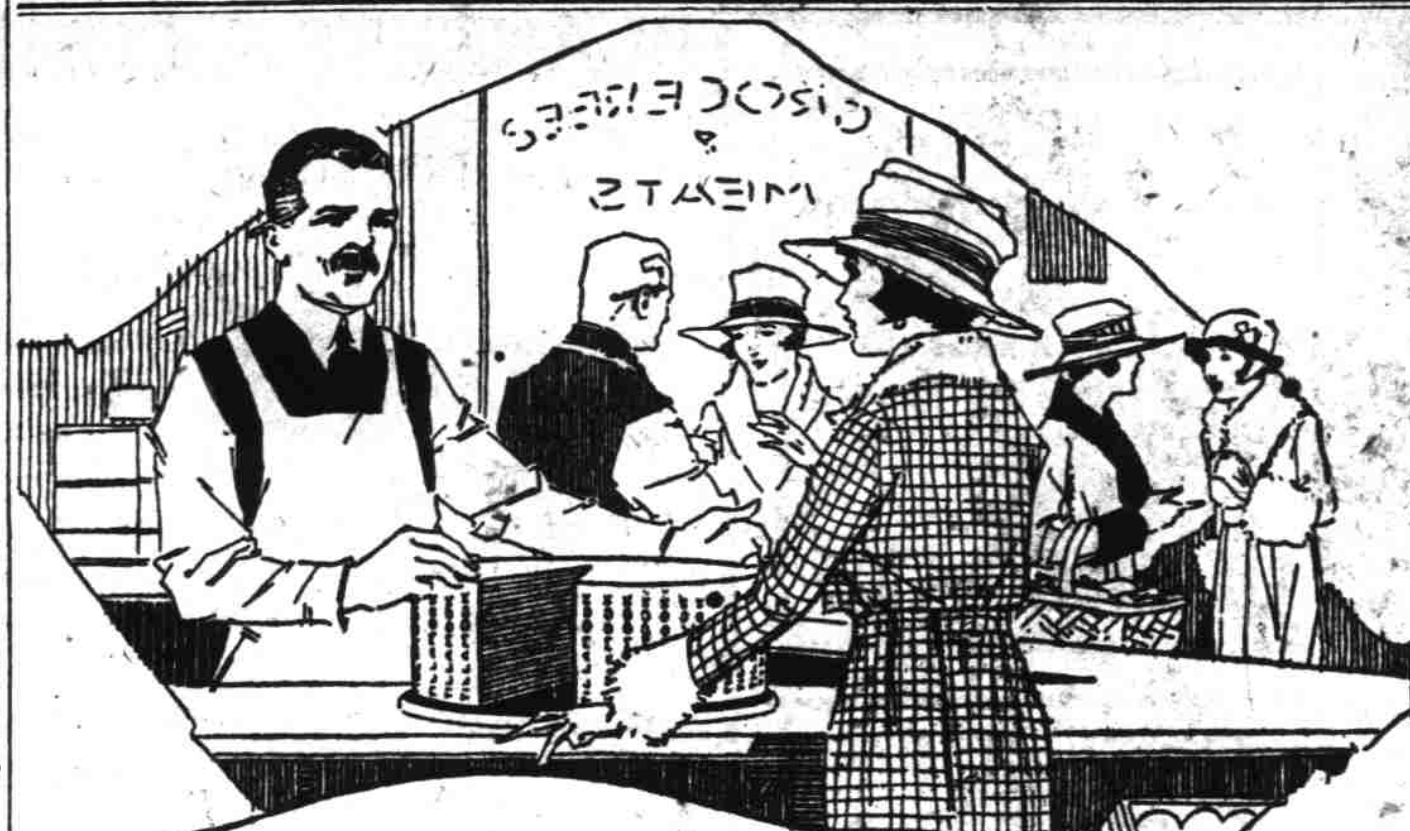
