WEATHER CONDITIONS
Low pressure prevails in Northern and Western Alaska and in the extreme southwest. Most of the remainder of the country is covered by high pressure areas. In the extreme northern Rocky Mountain region, precipitation has occurred over the belt extending from the Canadian border to the coast. In the extreme south, the weather is clear and dry. In the middle western and southwestern states, and along the Atlantic coast, freezing temperatures extend from the western Canadian provinces southward to Nevada.

Relative humidity at Portland—Non wet day, 49 per cent; 5 p. m. yesterday, 69 per cent; 5 a. m. today, 94 per cent.
Precipitation since January 1—Total, 27.07 in.; normal, 31.16 in.

OBSERVATIONS

Alaska and in the extreme southwest. Most of the territory of the country is covered by high pressure areas, one central in Tennessee and the other in the extreme northern Rocky Mountains. Precipitation has occurred over a belt reaching from Southern California to Alaska, and in New York. Snow is falling in parts of Canada, Idaho, Western Canada and Saskatchewan. Milder weather prevails in the middle western States, and in the States, and colder weather over the Northwest and along the Atlantic coast. Freezing temperatures are reported from the western Canadian northwest to Nevada.
