Four colonels of the Irish volunteers guarded the catafalque. A half hour before the main procession started, thousands of school children

wearing the Irish national kilts walked to the cemetery, where the remains of the late lord mayor were to be buried. When the procession started from the cathedral bearing the body of the Irish mayor to his grave, women fell to their knees weeping and praying.

Middleboro, Mass., Nov. 1.—Count Primo Macri, midget who became fa-Four officers of MacSwiney's staft circuses and vaudeville as "Tom shouldered the coffin along the route to Thumb," died here Sunday night at the age of 71.

Count Macri, who was given his title and a pension by Pope Pius IX, made his first appearance in a theatre at Bologna, Italy, his birthplace, in 1865. 
