Game Law Still in Force—Attorney-General Van Winkle has written an opinion in response to an inquiry by A. J. Moore, district attorney for Deschutes county, holding that the law is still in force in Oregon making it unlawful at any time "to hunt for or to have in possession any mountain sheep, mountain goat, antelope, elk, moose, caribou, beaver, female deer, or spotted fawn or young deer of the first year, or any portion thereof, except as otherwise provided by law."

Rev. C. S. Clapp Dies—Rev. C. S. Clapp, pioneer Congregational missionary and minister in the northwest, died at his home in Washougal, aged 76, Mr. Clapp was well known in Portland and throughout Oregon, having spent 19 years in missionary service of the Congregational church in this state, establishing many pastorates. He is survived by his widow, two sons and a daughter.
