

FRESH BEEF IS SELLING LOWER

Wholesalers are again cutting the price of fresh beef and there is not the slightest reason why consumers should not demand similar cuts from their retailers. In fact, in many of the downtown shops these cuts are being made, but some insist upon charging the same price for steaks now when No. 1 steer beef is quoted at not above 17c by packers and some time ago when better than 22c was paid. In fact some very good beef is being sold by wholesalers at 15c a pound.

Consumers should not lose sight of the fact that this means the entire carcass or side of beef. It means that the retailer is paying that price for the entire animal, which includes the cheaper priced meats as well as the higher priced.

It begins to look as iflard values will show another advance soon and

consumers who use this article may save considerable money by preparing for the event. An extremely heavy foreign demand is the reason for expectations of a higher price for lard.

Fresh pork has been selling more reasonable of late but indications point to an advancing price.
