

ARMISTICE DAY CELEBRATION PLAN PROMISES "PEP"

Stirring Parade and Thrilling Airplane Events to Be Spectacled as Feature of Historic Affair.

Elaborate preparations have been made for the celebration of Armistice day next Thursday, in which will participate especially veterans of not only the late war, but members of the G. A. R. and Spanish War Veterans. A huge parade will be the feature of the morning while the afternoon will be devoted to the aviation meet to be conducted on the Lewis and Clark field, under the auspices of the American Legion. Regardless of weather, the parade will start at 11 o'clock from Fourteenth and Morrison streets, and in columns of fours the wearers of the many uniforms will march through the city streets.

G. A. R. TO MARCH

The G. A. R. and auxiliaries will take part, and since many of the comrades cannot march, automobiles and drivers are desired by the parade committee for their use. These automobiles should be at the court house at the Fourth street entrance at 10 o'clock.

From their starting point, the huge column of service men and women's auxiliaries will march east on Morrison to Broadway, thence north to Pine, east to Sixth, south to Morrison, east to Fourth, then south to Main, where they will disband. The parade will be reviewed by the governor, the mayor and other state, county and city officials from the north steps of the Federal building.

Following the parade, at 2:30 p. m. will occur the aviation field meet. Forty Legion members will be on hand during the meet, in uniform, to assist the police to keep order on the field. Among the

exciting features will be a parachute jump from an airplane at high altitude.

The Aero Club of Oregon is directing the meet, for which seven entries have been received. The affair is the first of its kind to be held in the Northwest, and will be staged on Armistice day because of the prominence aviation acquired during the world war. An admission fee will be charged to the field. The stunt flying contests will be made at a point not visible from Linnton road or the hill beyond.

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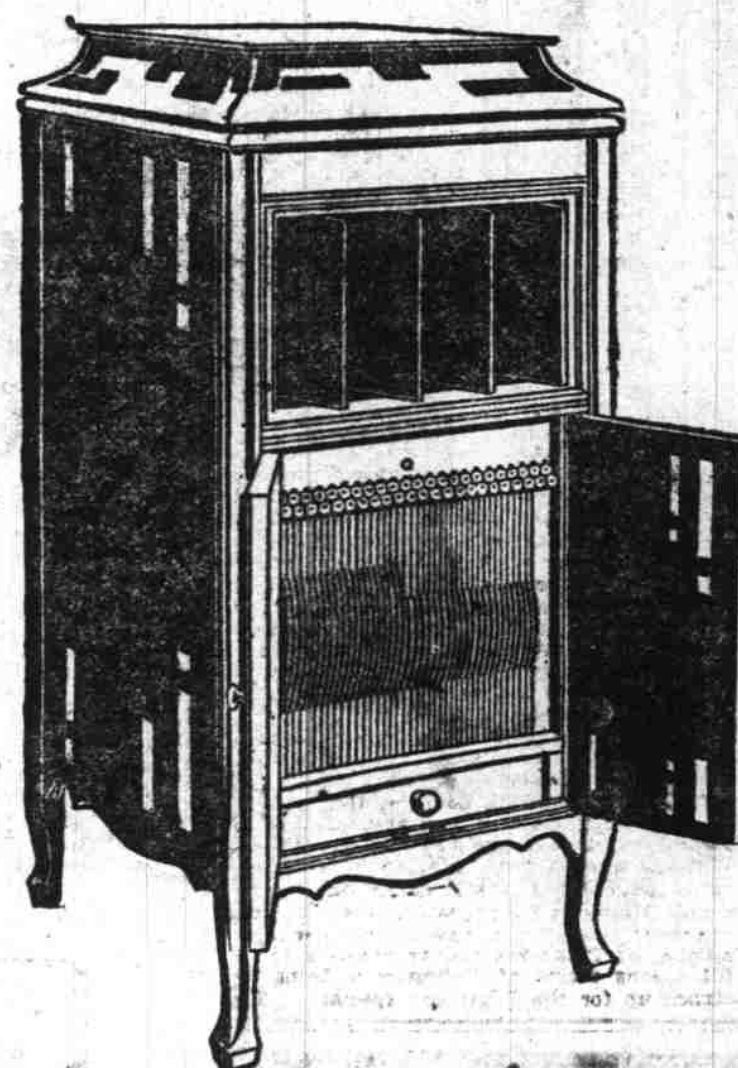
