

STEBBINGER BROS. ARE TO BE HELD TO ORIGINAL OFFER

Rescinding action at a former meeting the commissioners of public docks, at a meeting held this morning, decided to hold Stebbinger Bros. to the original contract and to waive acceptance of the bid of Tranchell & Parelus for the construction of a shed at pier 2, terminal No. 4.

The action of the board was based on an opinion of City Attorney La Roche, in which it was pointed out that Stebbinger Bros. must file an affidavit showing that the original bid was submitted in error and that an item of \$11,900 was inadvertently left out.

Bids for the construction of a shed at pier 2, terminal 4, were opened at the last regular meeting of the dock commission. The bid of Stebbinger Bros. was for \$174,532. The next lowest bid was that of Tranchell & Parelus, for \$184,562. Three other bids were offered.

At a special meeting called a week later Stebbinger Bros. filed a protest, claiming that they had failed to include an item of steel to the amount of \$11,900. They asked to be relieved and the bid was awarded to Tranchell & Parelus, next lowest bidder.

In the meantime came the opinion of City Attorney La Roche, and the dock commission voted to hold Stebbinger Bros. on the original bid pending the filing of an affidavit. The bid of Stebbinger Bros. plus the error, was \$186,432. Tranchell & Parelus agreed to perform the service for \$184,269.

JAPANESE STEAMSHIP IN PORT FOR GENERAL CARGO

The Japanese steamship Meiyu Maru entered at the customs house this morning. She had on board for Portland 300 tons of nitrate of soda and a small quantity of curries. The Meiyu Maru will load a full cargo of general merchandise at Portland for the Orient.

Clearing late this afternoon for the continent the British steamship Gera, laden by the Pacific Grain company, will leave down. She will be followed by the American steamship Jeptha of the General Steamship corporation, which will carry a full cargo for the West Coast.

Motorship Sold

Aberdeen, Wash., Nov. 8. — Wooden motorship Kirkland, built by the government at Seattle, was purchased for \$135,000 at sheriff's sale in that city Thursday by William Donovan, president of the Donovan Lumber company of this city. The craft will be placed in the lumber trade between here, Portland, San Francisco and San Pedro.

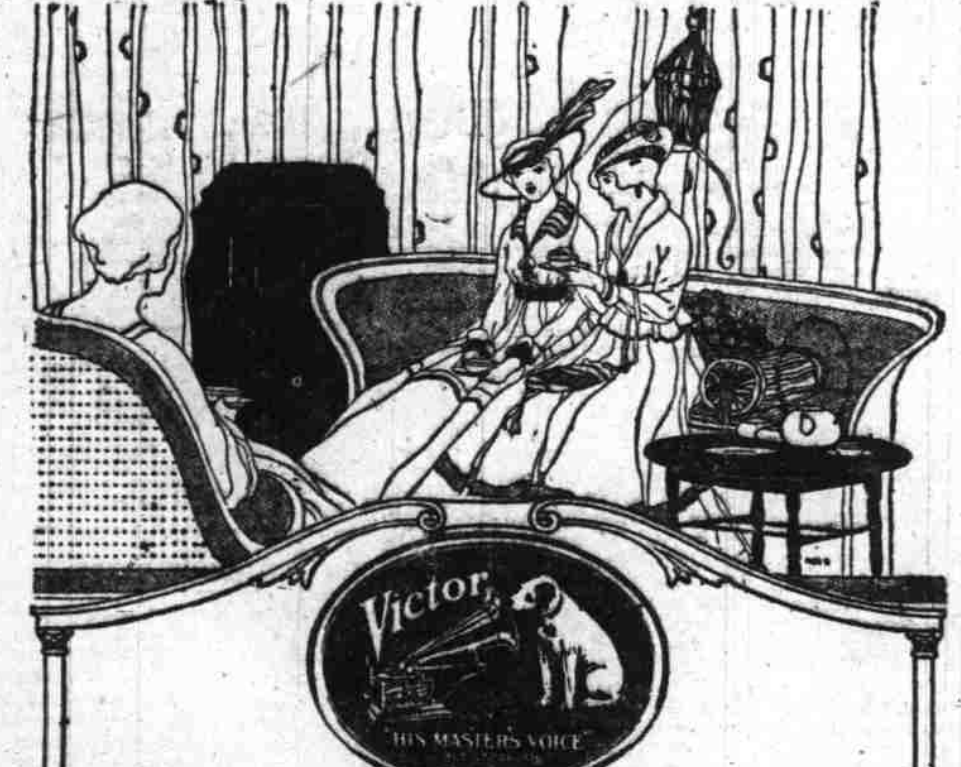

LAD STRUCK DOWN; DIES IN HOSPITAL

Clifford Hellyer, aged 8, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Hellyer of Warren, Or., was struck down and fatally injured near his home Sunday noon.

He was returning to his home with several other children from Sunday school when an automobile attempted to pass them. He became excited and ran in the path of the approaching car, according to information from his companions.

He was taken to Good Samaritan hospital here, but he died within a few minutes after his arrival. He had sustained a skull fracture and internal injuries, according to hospital authorities.

Hospital authorities did not learn the name of the driver of the automobile that struck the boy.
