

RAIN DOWNPOUR IS GENERAL IN STATE

Since Monday night 2.25 inches of rain have fallen in Portland. During Wednesday night .53 inches fell. More rain is the forecast.

But there is nothing unusual in this for this time of the year, says the weather bureau, and Portlanders may expect a continuance of rainy weather for several days at least.

The rain is general throughout the state. Some cities report a heavier precipitation and some a lighter. Marshfield, in the 24 hours ending at 5 a. m. today, had 1.20 inches of moisture, while Baker in Eastern Oregon had but .08 inch in the same period of time.

Willamette river flooding at Portland shows 3 feet and 7 inches, a rise of 1.1 feet during the last 24 hours.

SITUATION IMPROVED AT SAVAGE RAPIDS DAM

Grants Pass, Nov. 18.—The first estimates on the damage done to the temporary structure of the Savage Rapids diversion dam on the Grants Pass irrigation district were too large, according to a statement made Wednesday by E. J. Carrillo, superintendent of construction at the dam. Carrillo places the probable loss at less than a thousand dollars. He states that the dam is entirely out of danger and that work on the project will be resumed within 48 hours.

WILLAMETTE IS HIGH, MUCH SNOW IN HILLS

Quincy, Nov. 18.—The Willamette river is high and several feet of snow reported in the Cascades, and with the prevailing Chinook winds old timers believe that there may be a repetition of the high water of 1890, when the steel bridge went out at Salem and the disastrous wreck occurred on the Southern Pacific at Lake Labiah, an event that occurred 30 years ago, November 13.

Bridge Work Halted

Oregon City, Nov. 18.—With the water at a high mark in the Molalla river and constantly rising, work on the Dickey Prairie bridge has been halted. The temporary structure that has bridged the river for the use of the construction gang is expected to go out at any minute.

Episcopal Hospital For Marshfield, Plan

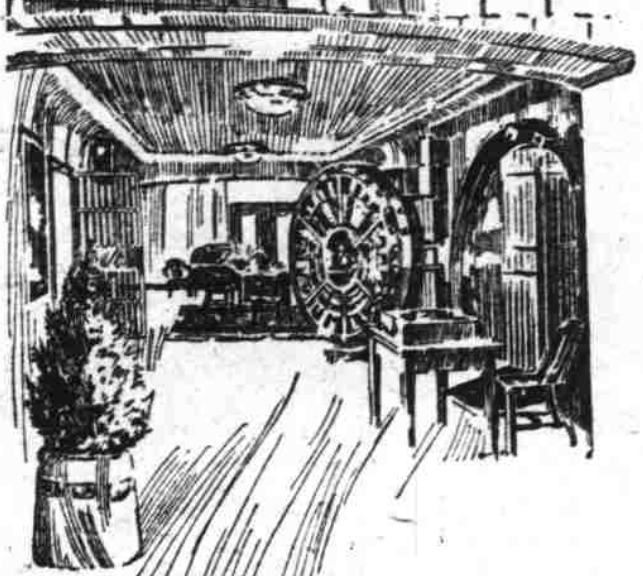
Marshfield, Or., Nov. 18.—Bishop Sumner of the Episcopal diocese of Oregon,

accompanied by Dr. Joseph and Miss Emily Loveridge, superintendent of the Good Samaritan hospital, Portland, visited Marshfield to discuss the plans for a proposed Episcopal hospital here. The Marshfield Chamber of Commerce has appointed a hospital committee which will take up the matter of finances. An estimate of the cost of building and

equipment will be made and the committee will ascertain how much money can be raised locally. It will probably be necessary to secure \$30,000 by contribution and raise the rest by a bond issue. Sites have been offered free by the Reynolds Development company and the Nasburg estate.
