

HEARING OF DAM CASE RESUMED AT KLAMATH FALLS

Klamath Falls, Nov. 19.—Discussion of the Link river dam controversy was continued today when the committee investigating the agreement between the United States government and the California-Oregon Power company, resumed its session.

The committee includes J. W. Brewer, field secretary State Chamber of Commerce, chairman; J. A. Gordon, banker, Klamath Falls; B. S. Morrow, engineer, Portland; Lester Work, American Legion; G. W. Offield, president, Klamath Irrigation district; Charles T. Darley, county surveyor, Klamath county; and Harry Holgate, United States reclamation service.

Organizations represented at the hearing include the California-Oregon Power company, Water Users' association, American Legion, Lumbermen's association, Klamath Falls Chamber of Commerce, and the United States reclamation service.

At Thursday's session J. R. Carnahan, commander of the Klamath Falls post of the American Legion, spoke against the government permitting the power company to construct the dam, claiming it would mean giving control of Upper Klamath lake to the corporation and mean the irrigation of California lands with water from Oregon which is needed for irrigation purposes in this state.

R. G. Groesbeck, speaking for the power company, denied it had any wish to control Upper Klamath lake or interfere with normal levels. The power proposition is a temporary one only, he said, designed to utilize waste water until it is needed for irrigation purposes.

Holgate, for the reclamation service, spoke in favor of the power company being given permission to construct the dam. Indians were represented as favoring the power company.

The committee has recommendatory powers only. Formal hearing will be before Secretary Payne of the department of interior December 4. Senator Chamberlain, acting on the request of the American Legion, had work on the dam suspended a year ago until the matter of the power company's aims could be thoroughly investigated.

It was charged during the last campaign that the California Power company contributed largely to the campaign against Senator Chamberlain as a result of his temporarily blocking the construction of the dam.

Justice of Peace Bound by Statute In Game Violations

Justice of the peace in Oregon cannot suspend sentence nor impose fines amounting to less than the minimum prescribed by statute in deciding sentence in game law violation cases, according to an opinion by I. H. Van Winkle, attorney general, to the state fish and game commission.

The attorney general further holds that the justice of the peace will be responsible in either case and that collection can be made from the judge where less than minimum fines have been imposed or fines have been remitted.

Recently J. Siegner of Portland was arrested at Canby for killing bob-white quail and was fined \$5 by Judge Knight of Canby when the game laws say the minimum fine shall be \$25. Knight will be held responsible for the difference between the minimum fine and the amount collected from Siegner according to Captain A. E. Burghdoff, state game warden.

Several weeks ago Ward Edwards of Jewell was arrested for having deer meat in his possession. He was fined \$50 by Judge John Carney of Astoria, but the fine was remitted. Carney will be responsible for the remission.

Chinamen to Return

Twenty-one Chinese residents of Astoria have filed applications and are preparing to visit China in the near future, says R. P. Bonham, head of the United States immigration bureau. This is the largest number of Chinese who have ever sought passports at one time.

Grace Cameron Is Feature Speaker At Press Luncheon

Grace Cameron, the Portland Press club's only woman member, gave the organization a treat Thursday by appearing in person at the regular weekly luncheon and presenting her husband, Duke Rogers, playing with her in the "Scandals of 1919." She will be guest of honor at a reception to be given in the clubrooms Saturday night following the performance. The entire company will be present.

Speakers at the luncheon were Mayor Baker and Commissioner Barbur. The mayor cited the difficulty in enforcing laws that have not the entire support of the public and decried the policy of certain so-called law-abiding citizens who say, "I use booze and it doesn't hurt me, but I don't want the other fellow to use it."

Commissioner Barbur emphasized the value of making public improvements for cost through public supervision of such utilities as paving plants. He, however, declared that same programs must be carried out and that it is impossible to consider putting in the nearly a million yards of pavement asked for next year.

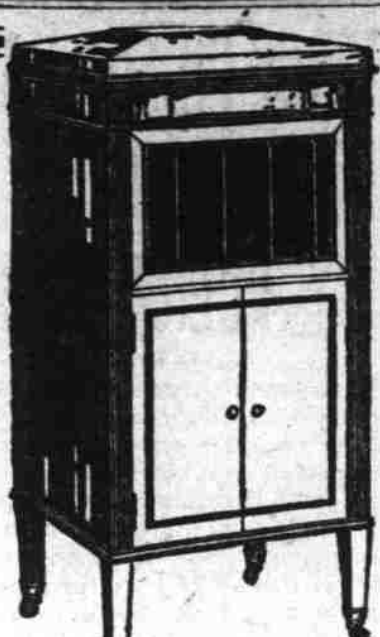

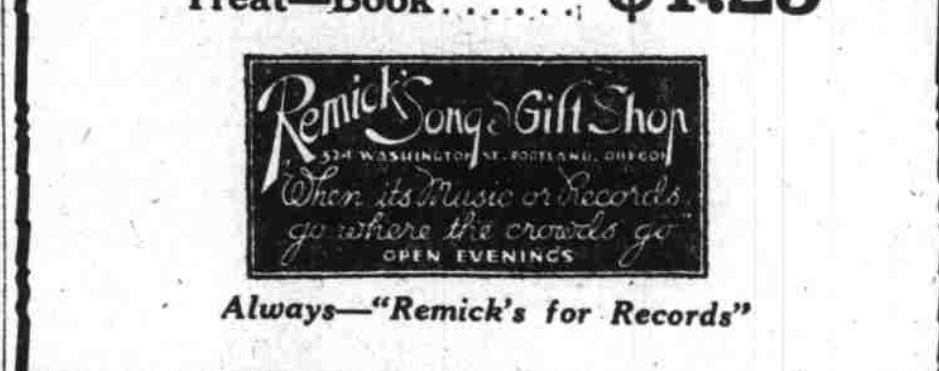
