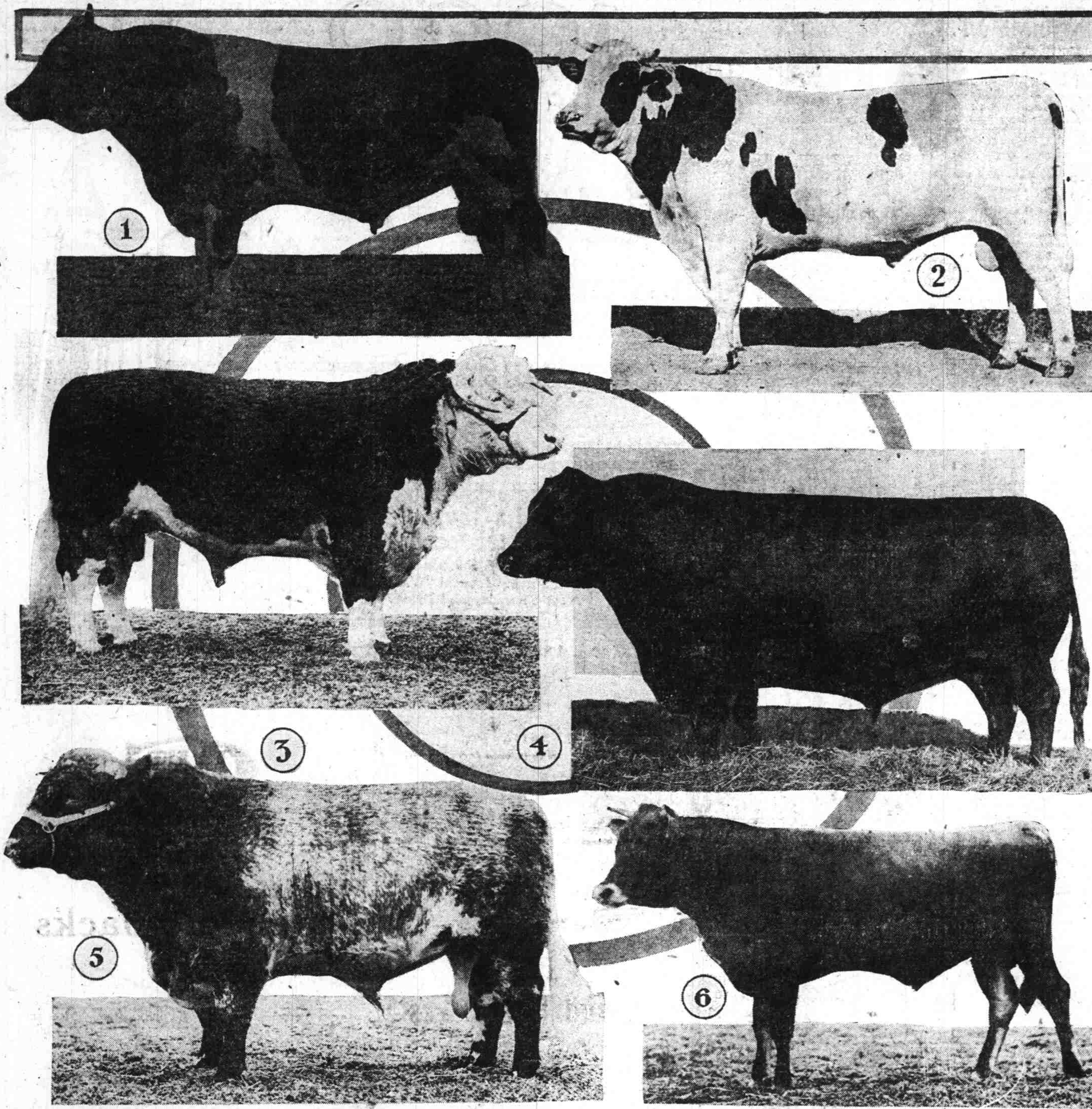


Champion and Grand Champion Awards Made at Greatest Show Ever Held

Total Prune Yield Gratiating Despite Unfavorable Season

A total of 8,628,667 pounds of prunes have already been delivered to the packing plants of the Oregon Growers Co-operative association this season, according to a statement recently issued. And this total does not include a number of districts that have made only partial deliveries and other districts which have not yet begun deliveries. This showing is regarded with much satisfaction by officials of the association, as it is well known that the last season was the most unfavorable in years for prune growers, many losing more than half their crop. 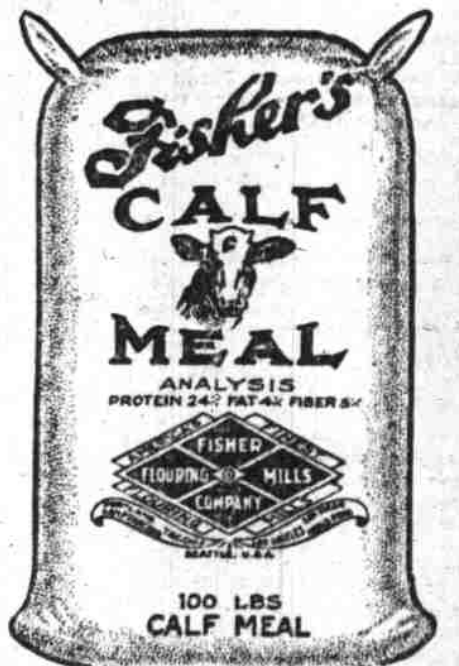

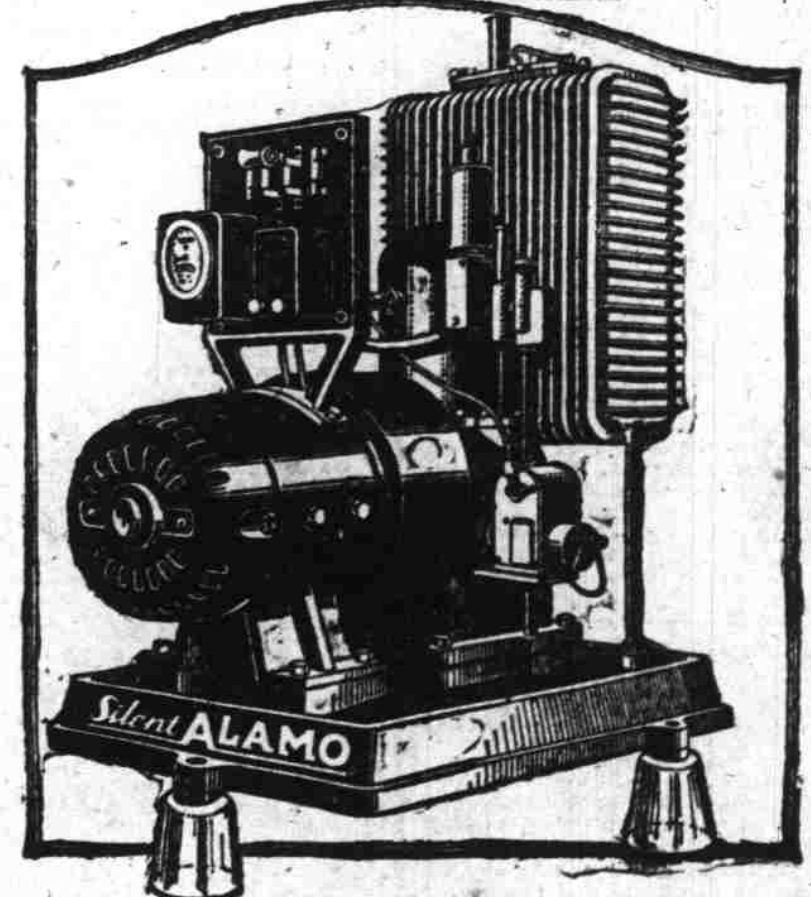
