Declares Pressure So Strong He
Could No Longer Resist; Many
Friends Urged Him to Serve.

ably the most essential, that our road program go ahead to successful conclusion. I will frankly say to you that during my term of office as governor I have never had a more important appointment to make than this and have never so keenly felt the need of a man rallying to my support as I feel the need now for you to come to my support in this important undertaking. It is a thing vitally affecting all of the people of the state and this road work is the biggest card in the deck. It has simmered down to the question of my merely not allowing you to refuse to accept the appointment. You must do it for the sake of Oregon and the immense things which are at stake."

POLICY NOT FORMULATED

"Besides being assured of the support of the governor," Yeon continued, "and the business interests of Portland, I was further influenced by the knowledge that I will have the direct advice and assistance of Amos S. Benson, who was my right hand in the Multnomah county work."

As to what his general policy will be, Yeon said he had not yet had sufficient time to formulate one, but would make an announcement in a few days on this line after he had studied conditions. "You can say though," he said, "that it has always been my ambition to keep roads out of politics."

It is well known that Yeon during his term as roadmaster of Multnomah county was an insistent stickler for permanent construction, taking the view that the cost of good work was soon forgotten, while that of poor work was always kept before the public.

CAME HERE WITH \$2.50

The accession of Yeon to the commission will be followed by a reorganization of the commission. As Commissioner Booth is the oldest member of the commission in point of service he probably will be elected chairman. Yeon is 55 years old and a native of Plantagenet, Ontario, Canada. He came to Oregon in 1885 with a capital of \$2.50 and first secured employment at Astoria at \$30 a month. He then became a lumberjack, drove an ox team and worked at other things around a logging camp. In a short time he began to operate on his own account as a logger. He met with marked success and in 1906 sold out his logging interests for a large figure.

Coming to Portland, he built what is now one of the largest office buildings of the city and engaged in other business enterprises.

"The secret of my success," he has often said, "lay in the fact that during dull seasons I did not close down my camps like most of the loggers did, but kept at work, keeping my equipment in shape and assembling my logs so that when good times came again I was ready

to put my logs on the market and get the top price."

TAKES INTEREST IN WORK

In 1913 Yeon became interested in highway development and was among the pioneers of the movement in Multnomah county.

In the spring of 1914, after the county had begun the construction of the Columbia river highway, it became apparent that a strong executive was needed to prosecute the work.

Yeon was selected for this work and in order to give him legal standing he was made roadmaster of the county without salary.

He took an active part in the campaign for the Multnomah county road bond issue and in the subsequent road work of the county for four successive years. He was also an important factor securing the creation of the state highway commission and the enactment of measures financing its work.

In 1918 he resigned as roadmaster and went to work for the government as a dollar a year man. He served as supervisor of spruce production on the lower Columbia, being given full authority by General Disque. During this serv-

ice he was offered the military rank of major, but he refused it, disliking to go around wearing spurs. For the past two years Yeon has been building up his private business interests.

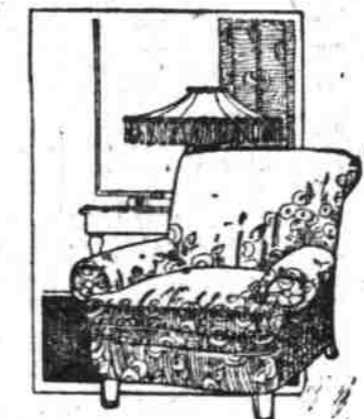

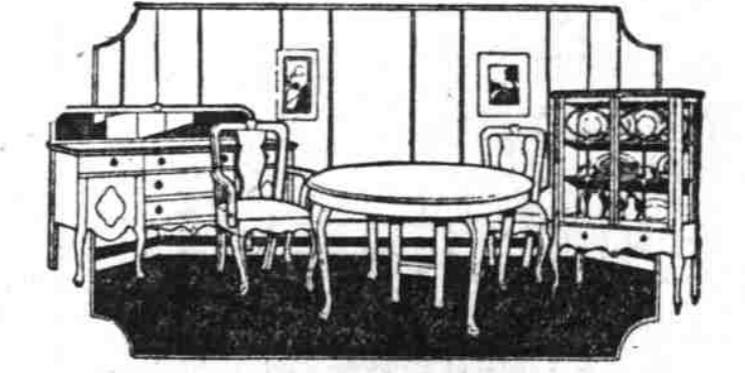

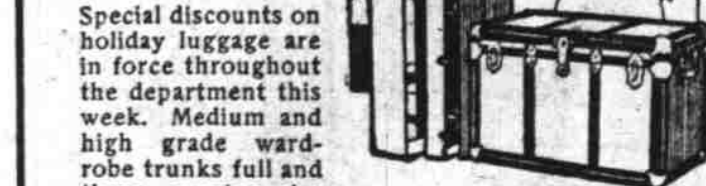
