

DRY FORCES FIND THANKSGIVING DAY ONE OF GRATITUDE

Washington, Nov. 25.—(I. N. S.)—“The dry forces of the United States have many reasons to be grateful at this Thanksgiving season,” said Wayne E. Wheeler, general counsel and legislative superintendent of the Anti-Saloon league, today. “A great nation has demonstrated that it is not dependent on revenue derived from liquor.”

“The growing tendency of the press is to tell the facts about prohibition and officers who will not enforce it.”

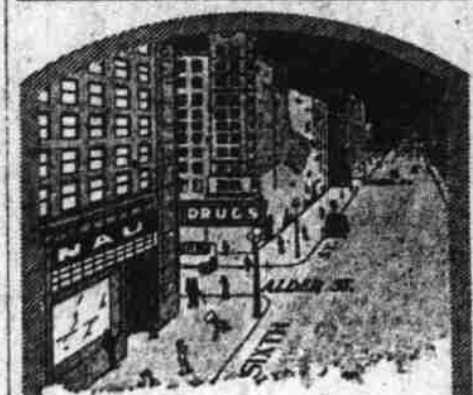

The home is having a chance to show its superiority as a substitute for the saloon.”

Connecticut Elects Five Women on Its Legislative Ticket

New York, Nov. 25.—(I. N. S.)—Connecticut, the last state to ratify the constitutional suffrage amendment, elected more women to its state legislature than any other state, according to report published by the National American Woman Suffrage association. Connecticut elected five women, as against four in Kansas and three in California, where woman has had the vote for several years. Utah elected three, and New Hampshire, New Jersey and Oklahoma two each. Twenty-nine women were elected in 16 states.

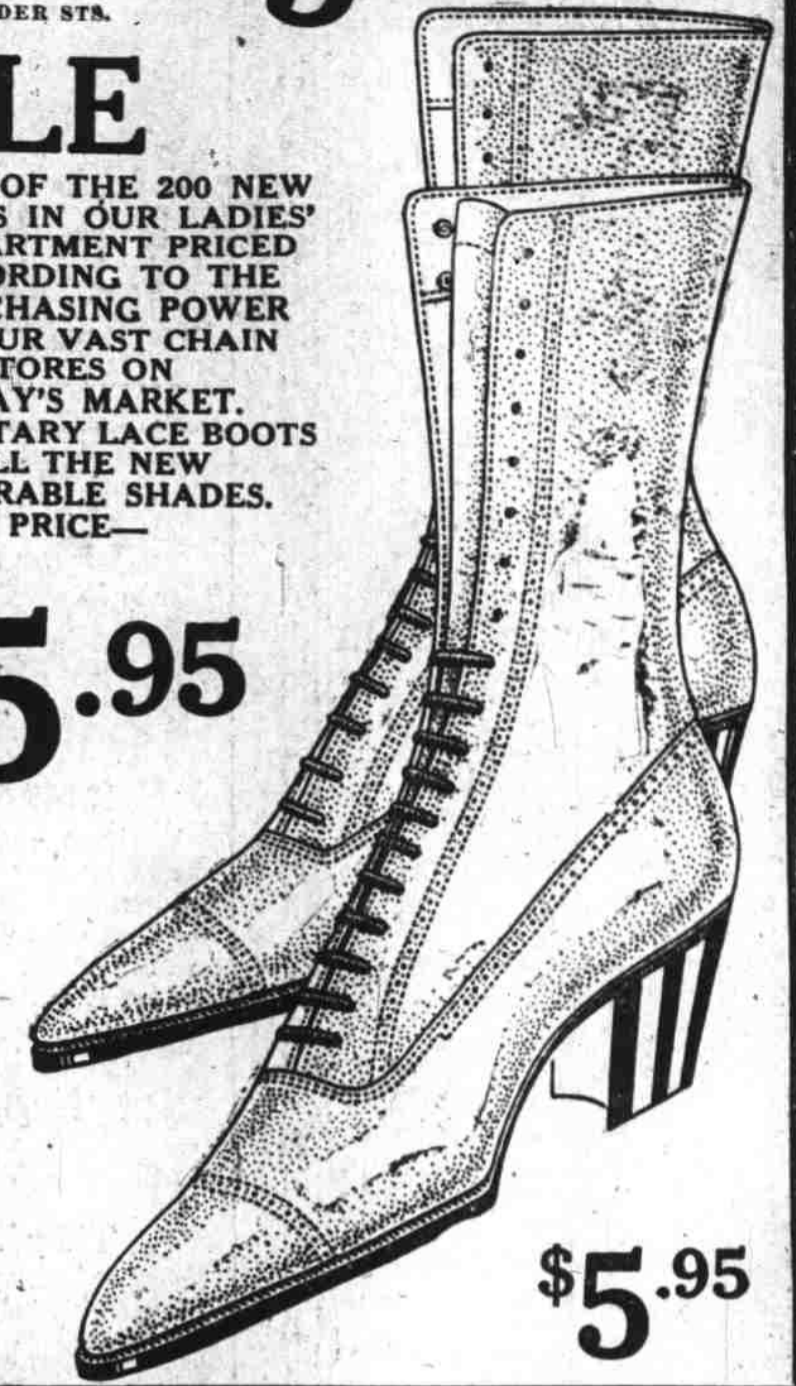

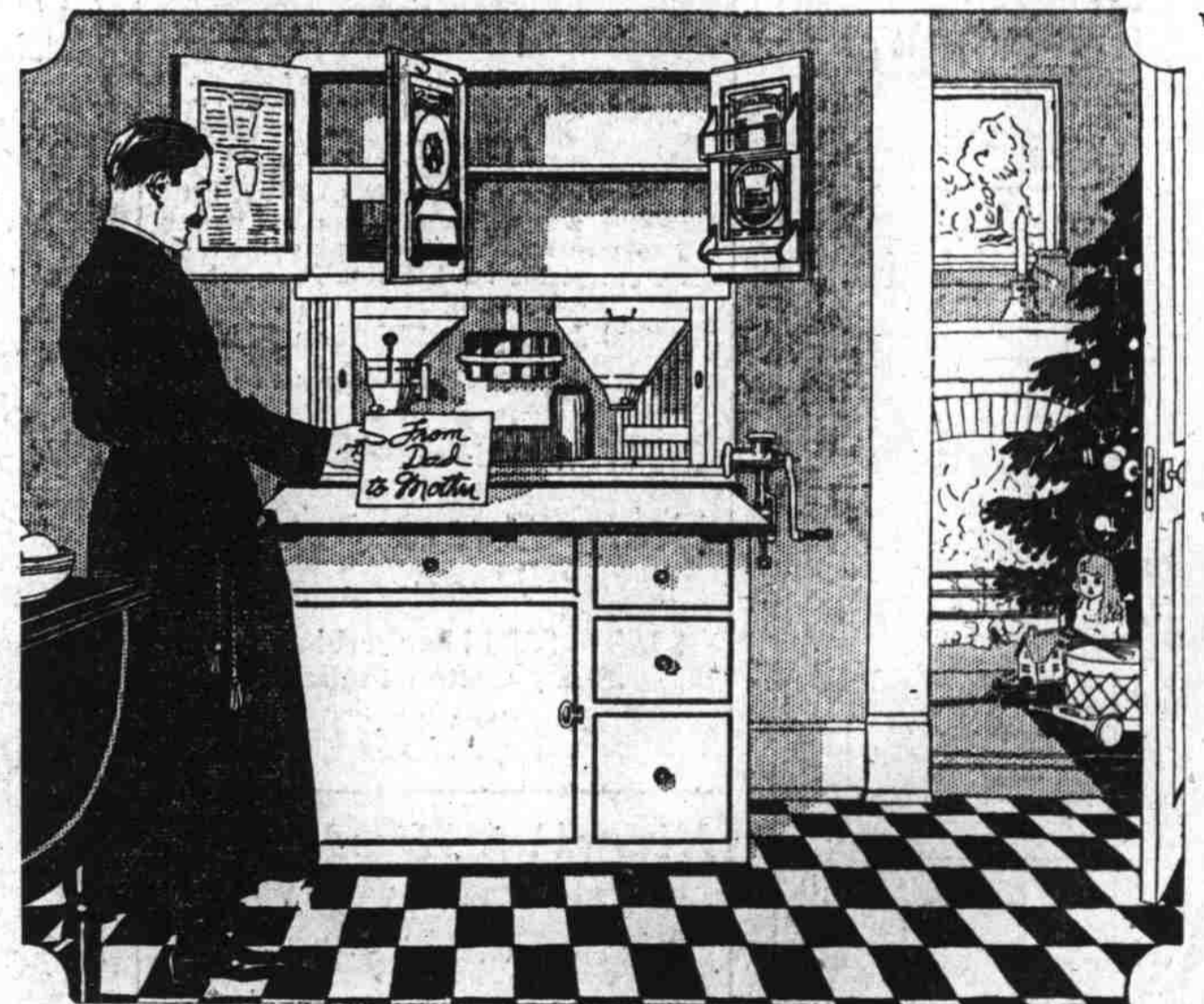
