

GET BOX OF APPLES AT LOWER PRICES

Consumers should take advantage of the present slump in the apple market to secure a box or so of supplies at this time. Apples have not been so cheap for a number of years as they are today and retailers are selling offerings at the lowest possible margin.

Oranges have been so high that few consumers have been willing to pay the price. Within a few days sharply lower values are due.

The markets are still well stocked with grapes which are selling at about the same prices as during the production period.

Eggs are lower in price and a further break is not at all unlikely within the immediate future. However, both butter and egg values will be influenced during the next 10 days by weather conditions.

Potatoes are showing practically no change in price and there is no reason
