

**PUBLIC TASTE IS TURNING TO FISH**

Turkeys are today selling considerably below the actual prices paid in the wholesale markets and retailers are losing much money as a result.

Sales of fancy birds are shown from 40 to 50 cents a pound at retail, while the bulk of the wholesale sales was made around 50¢ to 52 cents a pound.

The public is tired of fowl and is therefore turning again to fish and other foods. There is a very liberal supply of fresh halibut now on the market and it is of extremely good quality. Sales are shown down to 25 cents a pound in the retail shops.

There continues a shortage of good quality fresh salmon and prices are held high, but no higher than halibut.

Within a short time first arrivals of Columbia river smelt are expected by the local trade.

The following prices ruled generally in retail shops for good quality. Some values are fractionally higher and inferior stuff fractionally lower:

Butter—Best creamery, 65¢ @ 66¢.  
Eggs—Fresh laid, 50¢ @ 90¢ dozen; ordinary fresh, 75¢ @ 85¢ per dozen.

Vegetables—Chicken, dressed, 40¢ @ 45¢ per lb.  
Fish—Salmon, 15¢ @ 20¢ lb.; halibut, 25¢ @ 30¢ per lb.

Flour—Best local patent, \$2.85 @ 3.00 per sack, 49 lbs.  
Potatoes—Burbank, 2 1/2 @ 3¢.  
Onions—Oregon, 2 1/2 @ 3¢.

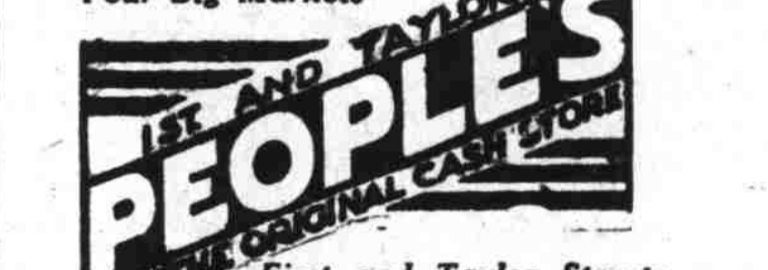
