1921 COUNTY ROAD BUDGET TOTALS ABOUT \$580,000

et for 1921 as tentatively prepared by the board of county commissioners, calls for approximately \$580,000, a slight increase over the budget of 1920, which was \$558,639.

To the improvement of Montgomery drive, \$39,000 is alloited. The amount expended on this road during the current year will be \$89,000. For Fairmount boulevard \$15,000 has been set aside in next year's budget. Other main projects provided for in the budget are the grading and paving of the Foster road within the city limits. \$85,000; the pavement of the Fairview road from the Base Line to the Sandy road, \$48,000; rebuilding the Burlington bridge, \$25,000; improving Columbia boulevard 4 miles, from Sandy road junction to the present pavement, \$25,000; paving Keilogg street, \$20,000.

No provision is made for the pave ment of the Base Line extension to the Automobile club house or for the pavement of the St. Johns, or Greeley street, road recently constructed. This improvement is being urged by the dock mission and others interested in the industrial district, which is served.

The new grade has been macadamized. but it is said that the cost of maintenance will justify pavement now, at least of 8000 lineal feet where the grade is stable. The cost of this would approximate, according to the estimate, \$60,000 or \$70,000.

In the machinery equipment the budget makes provision for trading in a gasoline shovel for a new one at a cost of \$15,000. The present shovel was purchased two years ago.

The amount to be required for the road budget will include approximately \$100,-000 which the county will draw from the state market road appropriation out of its \$300,000 contribution and \$175,000 from the state motor vehicle license fund.

43 Days Are Passed Without Death Due To Auto Collision

Portland is again on the way to a record of deathless days from automobile accidents. Not since October 21, when little Peter Kuhn was ground down under the wheels of a heavy truck, has there been a fatal accident in Portland. The record of deathless days has now reached 43, and November is the first month since January in which there has been no killing.

Only twice during the last two years has Portland gone for 43 days without an automobile death. The record was set during December, January and February when 81 days clapsed without a fatal collision

The record of traffic accidents during November is by far the best in recent months. There were no killings, the number of injuries dropped from 150 in October to 117 last month, and collisions decreased by more than 100.

Of the 1079 smashups, 230 resulted from failure of drivers to give right of way, 50 were results of cut corners, 42 were caused by lack of control of the machine and 16 by failure to signal, There were 13 accidents from reckless driving, 12 from operating on the wrong side of the street and eight from speeding. Other forms of carelessness were responsible, the traffic report indicates, for 683 smashups.

Of those injured, 76 were pedestrians.
