Kerr, Gifford & Co. will load the Swedish motorship Buenos Aires at Vancouver, B. C., with Canadian wheat for the United Kingdom. This will be the first cargo to be dispatched from a Pacific Canadian port for several years.

Federal Reserve Bank Lists Two Series for Sale

Telegraphic information was received this morning by the Portland branch of the Federal Reserve bank that the secretary of the treasury offers for subscription two new series of certificates of indebtedness.

Treasury certificates of indebtedness of series TD-1920, maturing December 15, 1920, A-1921, maturing January 3, 1921, and B-1921, maturing January 15, 1921, will be accepted at par, with separate adjustment of accrued interest.

The certificates are exempt from all taxation of the United States or any state, except estate or inheritance taxes and excess profits and war-profits taxes.

Series TD-1921, is the fourth issue of certificates which the government has offered investors at 6 per cent. This is the highest rate the government has ever paid for its securities.
