

COUNCIL TO HALT EVASION BY SOFT DRINK DISPENSERS

The schemes to which the bootleggers resort in order to continue their illegal traffic and foil the police department's activities is appalling, and were the same energy, enterprise and cunning directed in legitimate channels the purveyors of illicit intoxicants would become wealthy, in the opinion of Acting Mayor Bigelow.

One of the tricks of many of the 67 soft drink dealers who are to appear before the council beginning Thursday morning for involuntary retirement from business is that of taking out another license in the name of an employee, relative or acquaintance, according to Bigelow.

TAKEANICKLE COMES BACK
"As an example, the council might cancel the license of a Chinaman by the name of Ah Sing, and immediately another license would be taken out by West Sing, or Hae Sing, or some other Chinaman employed by the original Ah Sing," said the acting mayor. "Or Takeanickle Pappas would be put out of business to be at once succeeded by Catchadimeus Sisterus. In each case the same old dealers would be found on the

premises engaged in the same old bootlegging game. This the council purposes to stop by checking against the place through the police department."

Numerous soft drink dealers whose licenses will be revoked this month have already taken out licenses for the new year, hoping to start again January 1. These men will be disappointed, however, as Assistant City Attorney Mackay has a memorandum of the new licenses furnished him by the city license bureau and the council will revoke both old and new licenses in each case.

PLAN CAREFUL CHECK

Licenses for the new year were issued in many instances on the indorsement of the police department, notwithstanding the department had previously asked the city council to revoke their 1920 license. The records of all dealers under condemnation will now be kept at the police station by the same officer who must pass upon applications for new licenses, Bigelow said, and in the future the police department will not be put in the embarrassing attitude of innocently indorsing a new license for the men they seek to put out of business.

Every street number where a license has been revoked will be watched carefully in the future to see that former bootleggers do not get back into the business through trickery.

"It is the individual law violator whom the council wishes to put out of business," Assistant City Attorney Mackay said, "and I am assured that the moment one of these men appears as 'assistant' or 'manager' of a soft drink stand the licensed dealer will be required to do some explaining to the city council."

The hearing of the first unit of 30 soft drink dealers Thursday will doubtless continue all day. The second unit of 14 dealers will be heard Monday next.

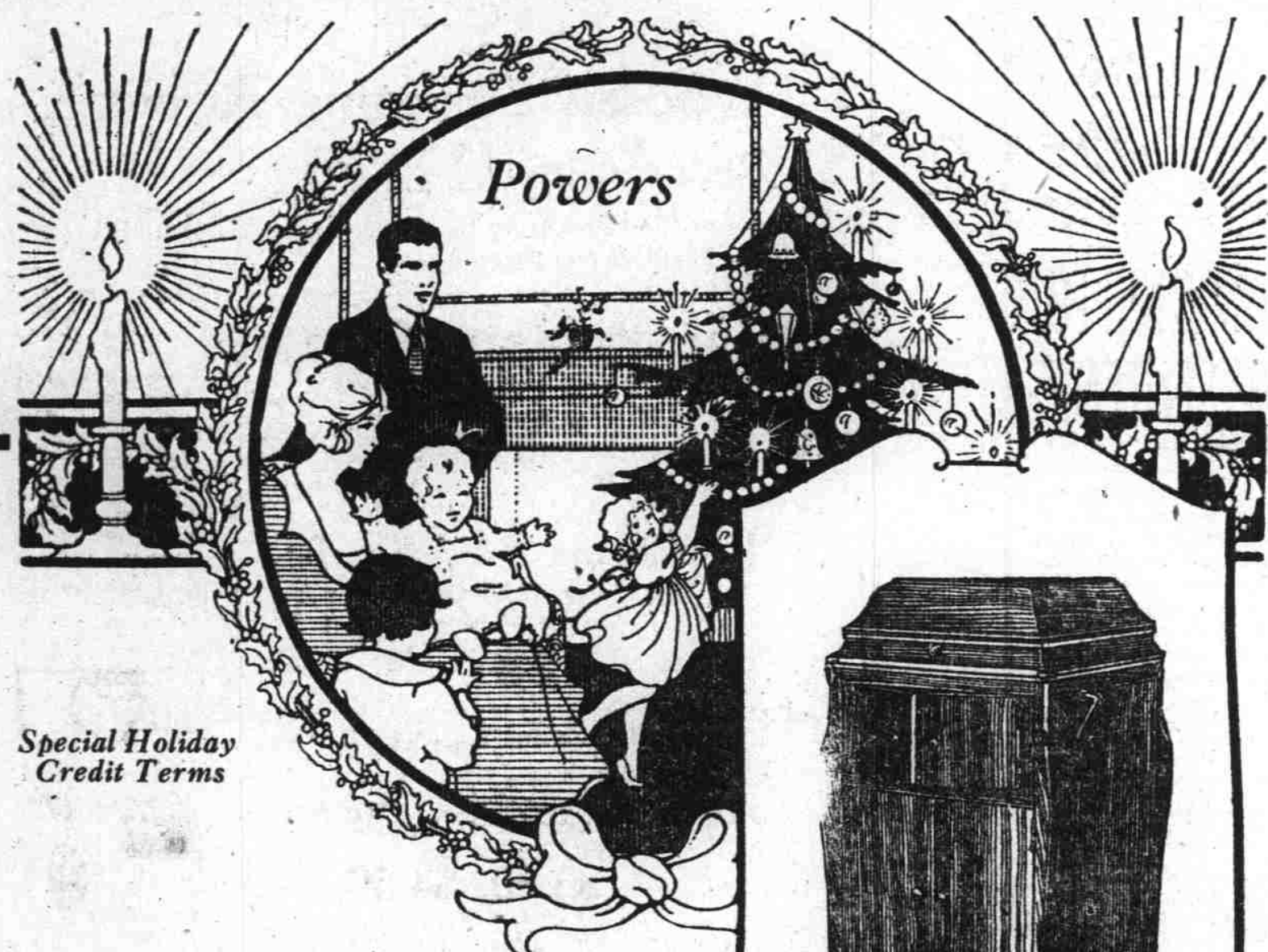

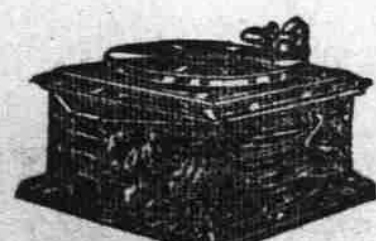

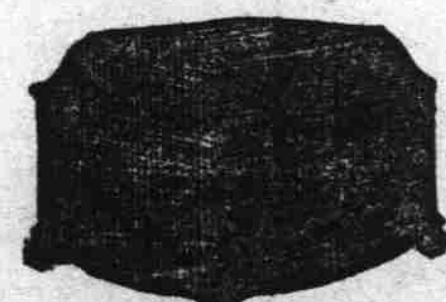
