

SUPPORT IS ASKED OF CHAMBER FOR ANTI-STRIKE BILL

Immediate support of the Poin-dexter anti-strike bill is asked from the Chamber of Commerce in a mes-

sage received Tuesday from the National Industrial Council at Washington, D. C. The bill was passed by the senate last Thursday, but is being delayed through movement by Senator La Follette for reconsideration.

Similar messages are being sent to other commercial organizations of the country. The message reads as follows: "It is vitally important that the Poin-dexter bill, passed by the senate last Thursday, which prevents interference with commerce, should receive immediate attention of your membership. Senator La Follette moves to recon-

sider the vote. Senator Poin-dexter is willing to agree to reconsideration of the vote only if La Follette reciprocally agrees to vote on fixed date early in January, otherwise Poin-dexter will move to table the reconsideration. "Refusal of the Poin-dexter offer will indicate that the opposition is determined to obstruct the measure and not anxious to have a vote on merit.

"The bill will make it criminal to persuade or threaten employees of interstate carriers to quit employment for the purpose of obstructing the movement of commerce. The same penalty attaches for disabling physical facilities of commerce for the same purpose. "It likewise penalizes conspiracy of officers, agents or employees of carriers

to obstruct or prevent their operation as a means of settling any controversy which can be settled under machinery of the transportation act. Right of individual employees to quit fully recognized and adequately protected. Essential that all believing in assurance of uninterrupted transportation should communicate with their senators.

FARMERS' COUNCIL OPPOSES ANTI-STRIKE LEGISLATION
Washington, Dec. 22.—(U. N. S.)—Declaring that farmers believe "strikes may be necessary to protect labor," George P. Hampton of the Farmers' National Council has addressed a letter to leaders of both parties in congress opposing

the enactment of anti-strike legislation. "Farmers as a body do not like strikes," Hampton declared in his letter, "but farmers do not blind themselves to

the self-evident fact that under our present industrial organization, strikes, even on railroads, after due notice has been given and negotiations have been held,

may be necessary to protect labor and to enable labor to secure its just rights. "Farmers realize that if striking by labor is made a felony the next step

logically would be to have the curtailing of acreage or the commodity by marketing of farm staples which is necessary to secure fair prices a felony as well."

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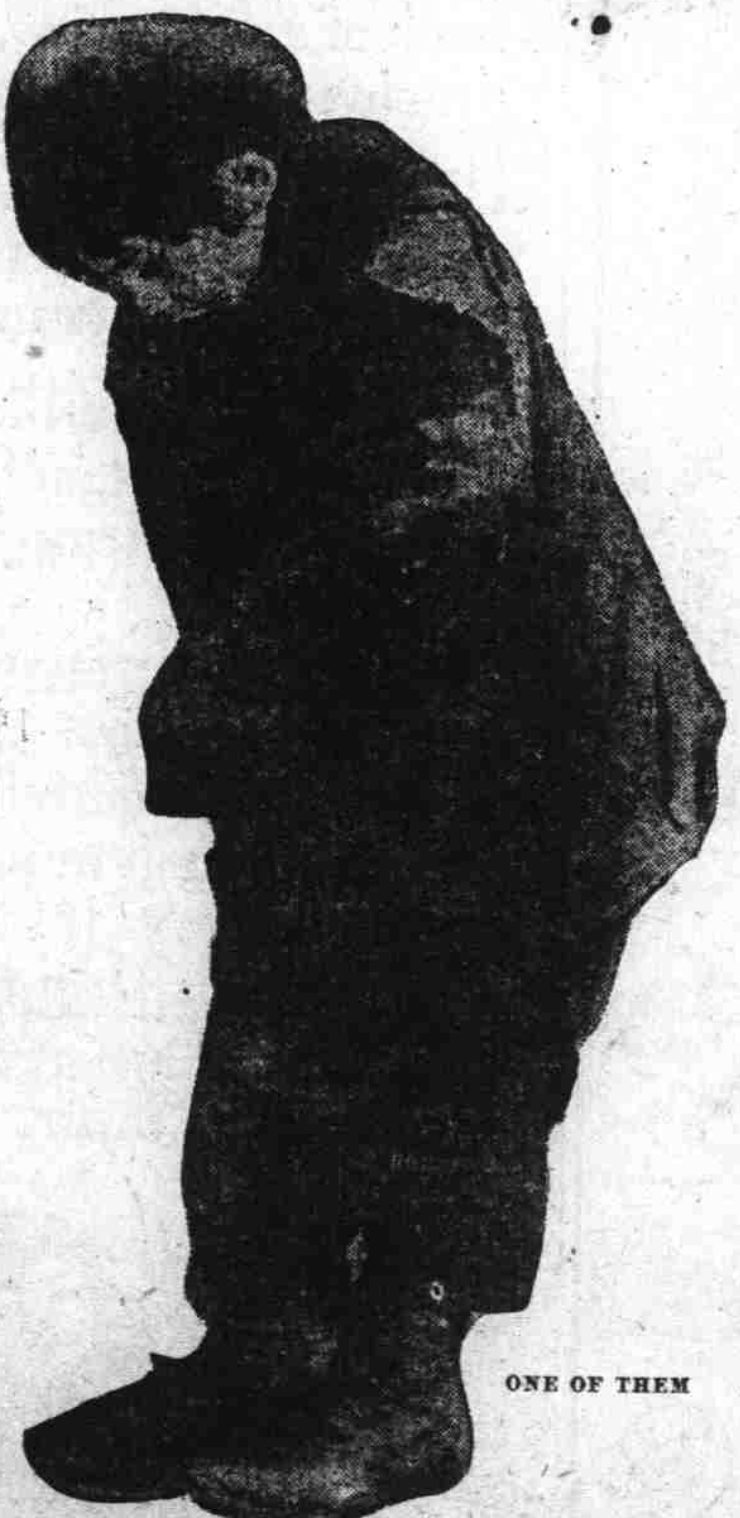
