

### STREET HAZARDS DISCUSSED BEFORE AUTO OPERATORS

"Hazards of the street may be divided into two classes," declared A. J. Johnson, assistant commissioner of public works for the city of Portland, speaking Monday night before the automobile operators in Library hall. "The first is the natural hazard, which can be taken care of by natural care and watchfulness on the part of the motorist. Steep hills and sharp curves are the worst of these and familiarity with his own car will permit a motorist to adequately protect himself and his property."

### ARTIFICIAL HAZARDS

"Artificial hazards are more dangerous. Here we may place the hard-surfaced road, or asphalt or wood blocks," continued Johnson. "When a light film of oil is spread on this paving by continual traffic, and rain is added to the oil, motorists have a slippery surface dangerous in the extreme. It is only by carefully testing his car when first coming out in the morning that a driver can be sure of his braking power and his tendency to skid. Artificial hazards are ever present and must be guarded against by more than ordinary caution."

### DANGER IS CITED

Twenty-ninth and Thurman streets was also cited as a dangerous point. In 1919, when paving was to be laid on the hill, where engineers found a 19 per cent grade, residents insisted upon asphalt. City engineers insisted that asphalt would be too slippery, but asphalt with a rock surface was finally laid. In time this rock surface has worn smooth and now the hill is one of the worst artificial hazards in the city.

### J. R. Stair of Benson Polytechnic Institute spoke on carburetion. His talk had to do chiefly with the practical side of correct carburetor adjustment and care. He declared that the carburetor of today was far from satisfactory and that eventually it would be built to handle heavier fuel, which would mean more power.
