Club Women
Advocate
Building

THAT the women of Portland are at last to have a building in which to house their activities seems to be nearer a reality than ever before. A mass meeting of 200 women representing various organizations was held Tuesday afternoon at the Hotel Portland, the gathering having been called by Mrs. J. Steele, head of the Presidents' club. The great need of a building that would be suited to the use of all of the women's organizations was brought out in the discussion.

Mrs. Percy W. Lewis said that an excellent site had been found and that inquiry revealed that many musicians would like studios in such a building. Mrs. G. J. Frankel advocated an auditorium of amphitheatre form. Mrs. Anton Gleibisch suggested that one floor be used as a dormitory for visiting women. Mrs. George E. Frost advocated interesting individual women as well as organizations making the matter one of personal responsibility. Mrs. C. E. Runyon said the Woman's club had succeeded in paying for its lot and hoped soon to issue bonds for its building. Mrs. S. M. Blumauer said that if results were to be obtained a more aggressive method would have to be followed than that pursued by the Woman's club, which has been more than 20 years in securing the \$12,000 necessary for the purchase of a lot.

Others speaking in enthusiastic terms for the proposed woman's building were: Mrs. E. P. Preble, Mrs. G. L. Buland, Mrs. Esther A. Jones, Mrs. D. M. Watson, Miss Vella Winner, Miss Viola Orschild, Mrs. Jennie Richardson, Mrs. Julia Marquand, Mrs. Frances Whitehead and Mrs. J. E. Withrow. Additional interest was lent by the inspiring addresses given by W. P. La Roche, L. M. Lepper and H. W. Kent, who assured the women that the men of the city would stand behind them in the project. Mr. La Roche told of the half block south of Central library which is offered for \$150,000 and which is considered an admirable location for the building. Mrs. Steele pledged \$100 toward the project, Miss Orschild \$50 and Mrs. H. C. Raven \$25, these pledges being purely voluntary and spontaneous. The following committee was appointed to submit further plans for a site, a building and a means of financing the project at a meeting to be held next Tuesday: Mrs. Alexander Thompson, Mrs. S. M. Blumauer, Mrs. George E. Frost, Mrs. Helen C. Jeselsen, Mrs. Anton Gleibisch, Mrs. Julia Marquand, Mrs. Murray Manville, Mrs. C. M. Dowling, Miss Viola Orschild.

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
