

IRRIGATED LANDS EXHIBIT MAY BE SHOWN IN CONGRESS

Washington, Jan. 6.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)—Senator McNary believes it will be of decided advantage to the West to have an exhibit of irrigated land products where senators and representatives can see it, particularly during the next extra session of congress when it is hoped that a comprehensive policy of reclamation can be outlined.

With this purpose in view the Oregon senator has secured permission for installation of exhibits in one of the large caucus rooms of the senate office building, which was at one time used for exhibition of official war photographs. It is the senator's intention to have hangings on reclamation conducted in this room by the committee on irrigation, of which he is chairman.

Some of the towns of Eastern Oregon have indicated a desire to assist in such an exhibit, and the matter has been placed before the Western States Reclamation association, of which Governor Davis of Idaho is president. The reply from the association has so far not been definite, evidently from fear that sufficient funds cannot be supplied. Senator McNary thinks the exhibit can be made ready with very small outlay, the principal cost being in transportation charges, which in many cases will no doubt be defrayed by local organizations desiring to be represented. His idea is not to have a large display, but to have a few choice specimens from irrigated lands in different sections of the West.

Word has been received that a committee of four of the Western States Reclamation association expects to be here by the middle of January, headed by ex-Governor Sperry of Utah. It is not believed that anything substantial will be accomplished at the present session, however. No general legislation will be undertaken until after the new congress comes into session, which will not be until late in March. Most of the plans discussed are along the lines of the Smith-Fletcher bill, to include drainage as well as irrigation projects.

DOUTY CONTRACT EXCLUDES COMMON CARRIER CLAUSE
Washington, Jan. 6.—Lieutenant Colonel Charles Van Way of the air service, in a letter to Senator McNary, says that F. A. Douty of Portland, who is negotiating to purchase the Yaquina logging road built by the government, is unwilling to include a common carrier clause in his contract, and the government is not disposed to insist upon it, since it is understood that the people of Newport and Yaquina are willing to forego such a clause rather than permit the contract. He adds that after the preliminaries are disposed of Douty is not averse to doing anything "which will serve the interests of the ports of Newport and Yaquina."

BILL CUTS CONCERNS MAY SUT TIMBER IN ANY STATE
Washington, Jan. 6.—The house has passed the senate bill to permit corporations organized under the laws of one state to cut timber in another state where it is engaged in business, just as though organized there. This relates to cutting timber on public lands for mining, agricultural or domestic use, under regulations approved by the secretary of the interior.

Wool and Livestock Men Needing Help Most, Is Testimony

Washington, Jan. 6.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)—The wool men, who "have no market at all" were declared to be worse off than the grain growers and the cotton men and others seeking relief legislation by W. P. G. Harding, governor of the federal reserve board, when testifying before the joint congressional committee. Governor Harding also spoke of the livestock interest as standing in a position by itself because, he said, many of the stockmen require accommodation for two years to finance the growing of the calves, while the ordinary farmer requires only a short time credit of six months or so which the banks can more easily meet.

It was for this reason that he suggested that Senator Hitchcock's bill to provide a fund of \$100,000,000 from the profits earned by the federal reserve banks this year and next for agricultural relief be devoted entirely to the aid of the livestock industry. It would serve that interest, he thought, but would be too small a fund to accomplish results if spread over the entire farming industry. It was Governor Harding's view that the farmers might well market a small part of their produce at reduced prices from time to time and thus assist in easing down the situation to lower levels, a process in which all must expect to share a loss or a reduction of expected profits. He denied that the reserve board has at any time counseled the banks against loans to farmers, the banks in each section being left to judge the essential needs of their customers and advised that productive and useful business should be favored.
