

SPINACH ARRIVES IN GOOD SUPPLY

Local fresh spinach is arriving in rather liberal supply and most markets are now quoting it at 10c a pound. The quality of the stock is unusually favorable for early arrivals as there has been no severe weather to toughen the plants.

Everyone is getting a good taste of Columbia river snijelt at this time. Sales are being made from 10c a pound down to two pounds for 15c.

There remains a great scarcity of fresh salmon and good halibut and there are few razor clams available. The market is supplied with bitter clams. Crabs are in fair supply with former prices in effect.

It begins to look as if really good quality potatoes will sell somewhat higher because of the scarcity of such stock. There is, however, an overabundance of common to fair stuff which is likely to remain low in price, at least for some time.

Prompt Payments Of Bills Slogan in Drive on Saturday

Keeping personal credit good by prompt payment of bills and having the means of taking care of obligations before asking for credit is the creed to be preached on Saturday in the Thrift-week campaign of the Y. M. C. A.

The error committed by so many people, both young and old, of making unnecessary purchases because credit is so easily extended, is pointed out. The remedy suggested is a personal budget and to regard each bill for merchandise as cash instead of waiting for the small amounts to reach a large sum.

Business men of the city endorse this phase of the campaign not merely because of the difficulty in collecting bad bills, but that credit granted may not exceed the wages of those taking the credit and thereby create a hardship.

Umatilla Sends Out Flour for Children

Pendleton, Or., Jan. 21.—More than 1200 barrels of export flour, Umatilla county's donation to the starving children of Europe, have been shipped from county mills to Portland, the estimated value being \$8100, or nearly \$500 above the quota assigned to Umatilla county. Approximately \$10,000 was raised here in one week's drive under the chairmanship of J. V. Tallman of the flour in jute sacks were accepted.

Silverton Man to Be Head of Bend School

Bend, Jan. 21.—The Bend school board elected Mark A. Folson, Silverton, Or. to the principalship of the high school, made vacant by the departure of J. L. Crozier. The board also announced the marketing of \$45,600 worth of district 6 percent notes at a price of 97 and 1/2 percent. Measures will be taken to secure the amendment of the present statute to allow the state treasurer to purchase notes issued by districts of the first class.

Returned to Face McMinnville Charge

McMinnville, Or., Jan. 21.—Sheriff Ferguson returned Phoenix, Ariz., with Charles Rowland, wanted on a charge of driving bad checks on banks in this county, issuing off the delivery car of Harper James and leaving it beside the road near Eugene. Rowland asserts he does not know why he is acted as he did. He will remain in jail until the convening of court the first Monday in February.

New Agreement for Oil Test Well Voted

McMinnville, Or., Jan. 21.—A new agreement for sinking an oil well in the Yamhill district was voted at a meeting of residents of Yamhill and vicinity on condition that a Portland promoter, who seeks an area of 12,000 acres on which to make the test, submits a bond that he will begin work within six months. Oil leases given some time ago are said to have elapsed.
