

LUMBER INTERESTS ARGUE FOR SNELL COOPERATION BILL

Washington, Jan. 27.—(WASH-INGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—E. T. Allen of Portland and other prominent representatives of the lumber industry in different parts of the country, appeared yesterday before the house committee on agriculture in support of the Snell bill for federal cooperation with states in conservation, reforestation, fire and control.

Clifford Pinchot, former chief forester, vigorously assailed the measure on the ground that it would favor the monopoly of timber owners and that it would permit the legislature of Washington, Oregon and California to virtually decide whether the bulk of future lumber supply shall be devastated or properly regulated. Timber land owners know they could prevent legislation from passing legislation they do not desire, Pinchot said.

Under the interstate commerce commission findings in the Columbia basin rate case railroads involved have until March 2 to file adjustments of the rates, this being 90 days from date of service. Meantime petition for a rehearing is expected to be filed by Seattle interests. No word has been received here as to the progress railroads are making with new schedules or when they will be filed.

Soft Drink Stands Accused by Police Of Breaking Faith

Former proprietors and undesirable habitués of soft drink stands and card rooms closed by the city council during its recent campaign against bootleggers and other law violators are drifting back into their old haunts, the police have notified members of the city council.

The newly-licensed proprietors were granted permission to open up on the condition that they would not allow the former owners and other undesirables to "hang around." Commissioner Bigelow reminded the council Wednesday. "If the new proprietors, or those we permitted to reopen on a promise of properly conducting their places are violating our confidence, then I think they should be put out of business at once."

Mayor Baker appointed Commissioner Bigelow to investigate.

Milton, Or., Jan. 27.—Mrs. James A. Lord, wife of Rev. James Lord, former pastor of the Christian church, died at the home of her granddaughter, Mrs. A. E. Scott, Tuesday after a short illness from pneumonia. Mrs. Lord was born in Kentucky and was 76 years of age. She is survived by her husband, one son, Earl Lord of St. Louis, Mo., and several grandchildren. The Rev. Mr. Lord is seriously ill as a result of the shock of his wife's death.

Service Commission Should Have Own Adviser, Says Grant

The state public service commission of Oregon should employ an attorney to counsel and advise with that board and with the communities affected by the various measures presented to that body for final disposition, in the opinion of City Attorney Frank S. Grant.

"In the past the city attorney's office has been compelled to neglect important matters needing prompt action in order to have the city's interests properly presented before the commission. This is not reasonable, nor is it fair to Portland, or to any other community required to supply its own legal counsel at commission hearings," Grant said.

The Oregon public service commission is the only body of its kind in the United States without a special attorney to advise with it and to act for the communities affected, according to the city attorney.
