DR. WILLET TO BE SPEAKER AT 1921 WINTER MEETING

SERIES OF SPECIAL MEETINGS PLANNED

Special Services Will Honor Lincoln's Memory at Portland Churches Sunday

EPWORTH SESSIONS WILL BE REPEATED FOR MISSIONS

FOR MISSIONS TO BE HELD AT Y. W.

Dr. Herbert L. Willett of Chicago, western representative of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, will be the principal speaker Monday night at the First Methodist church at the 1921 winter meeting of the Portland federation of churches. His subject will be "Advancing the Kingdom Through Cooperation."

Church people of Portland await with expectancy the big series of revival meetings to be held February 20 to March 9 at the Auditorium by the Rev. U. E. Harding of Indianapolis, and the Rev. Bona Fleming of Ashland, Ky., nationally known evangelists.

Incidents in the life of Abraham Lincoln will furnish many Portland pastors with their subject for Sunday. In a few churches this service will be combined with a Boy Scout celebration, as Saturday closed national Boy Scout week. The week before and after the emancipator's birthday also witnesses a large number of father and son banquets throughout the city. Patriotic music has been prepared by choirs in churches where the day will be celebrated.

The first mid-winter institute of the Portland district Epworth league has proved such a success that the district cabinet has decided to make it an annual affair. Two hundred leaguers had registered Friday.

Portland church women interested in home and foreign missions have set aside next Friday as a day of prayer for missions. A committee of 11 women representing the Portland federation of churches has outlined an elaborate program at the Y. W. C. A. from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m. Friday.

At this meeting the executive council will present a chart of the organization and activities of the federation to all those attending, and will also furnish a report of the last six months' work. The federation counts itself fortunate in having Dr. Willett as its special guest of honor. Dr. Willett will occupy the pulpit of the First Methodist church Sunday morning and the First Methodist church Sunday night.

Arrangements are now under way for a large chorus choir, which will be directed by Professor H. A. Shank of Cincinnati, a well known musician. Two thousand song books have been purchased so everybody can sing. Three singing evangelists, E. M. Cornelius, O. B. Myers and James Campbell, are now in the city preparing for the revival by singing in churches and factory noon meetings. Meetings will be held every night at 7:30 o'clock and every afternoon except Sunday, Monday and Saturday at 2:30 o'clock. On Sunday afternoon the meetings will be held in a large church.

The regular monthly meeting of the Baptist Home School Workers' union will be held Tuesday night in the Swedish Baptist church. Supper will be served at 6:15 p. m., and the program will commence at 7:30. The topic for discussion is, "How I Teach the Lessons." Speakers from the Baptist missionary conference will occupy the pulpit of the First Baptist church, Monday morning the Rev. C. A. Brooks, who has just returned from a year's study in the office of the Oregon Christian Missionary society. The Rev. Herbert L. Willett, Western secretary of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ, will speak.

The paragon, "The Pilgrims and the Book," given last Sunday at St. David's Episcopal church, will be repeated this Sunday night at 7:30. The offering at this service will be given to the Chinese relief fund, the same as last week. In the morning the Rev. Thomas Jenkins, rector, will preach.
