

SEAPORT NEWS

The Norwegian steamship Hermion, Newport News for Portland, has been rechartered to the United Kingdom. The Hermion is in Astoria, crossing in yesterday afternoon, too late to make the charter date previously fixed by the same exporting firm.

Differential in the rate between the original charter and the new charter is closed has not been made public, but in the opinion of shipping men the new charter is less by several shillings.

Another rate for charters of that of the Siam, a Norwegian motorship, now rushing for Vancouver B. C.

The Siam is also under charter to the United Kingdom. The Siam took on dunnage at the Golden Gate, and also a crew of liners. If she makes Vancouver by noon tomorrow, the charter will be saved to the owners.
