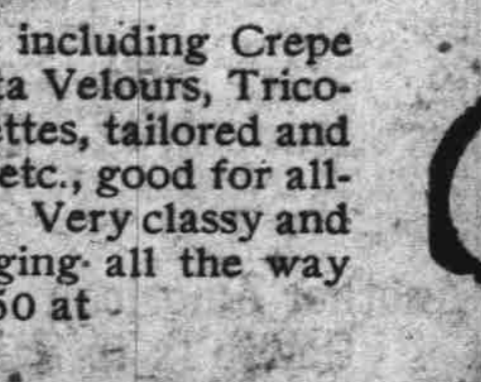

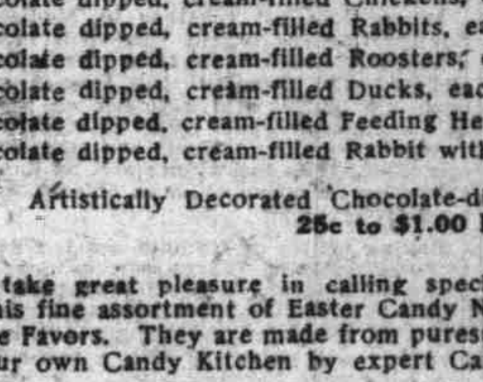
New Standard Oil Books Offer Price Guard to Purchaser

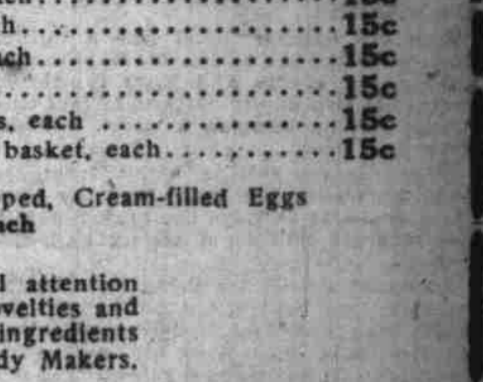
