

CLOSE FRIENDS OF HARDING ARE IN GREAT FAVOR

Washington April 1.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—It is natural that there should be great interest just now in the friendships of Mr. Harding. Few seekers for official favor can hope to reach the new president himself or to make any personal impression on him, even should they be fortunate enough to be presented for a three minute interview.

The important question is, "Who can put it over for me?" Those men who stand close to Mr. Harding and on whom he most relies for advice, will be much in demand. They are fairly well known, but some of those who figure prominently in the news are suspected of having less influence than some people believe.

DAUGHERTY IS MEDIUM

There is no question about Harry A. Daugherty, the new attorney general, a personal friend and political adviser of Mr. Harding from "away back," it seems safe to say that the man who gains the backing of Harry Daugherty will be laps ahead in the race and will make a good 20 to 1 choice.

Two other Ohio men in official life stand well up with Harding. Senator Frank B. Willis, who took the Harding seat in the senate, is one. Those who attended the Chicago convention remember his bellowing voice and the human appeal of his closing words in the nominating speech.

"Come on, boys and girls, let's nominate Harding."

Harding likes Willis and no doubt will listen to him with reason. He is also on the best of terms with Congressman "Nick" Longworth, the husband of Alice Roosevelt. It seems likely that Longworth will gain in prestige with the new administration.

Edward B. McLean of Ohio and Washington, publisher of the Cincinnati Enquirer and Washington Post, and Mrs. McLean, are cronies of the Hardings. They go on outings together. The McLean newspapers are already looked to as reflecting the Harding views, and Mr. McLean may be an important visitor at the White House.

WEEKS IS FAST FRIEND

Outside of Daugherty, two other close friends of Mr. Harding, both in the cabinet, are John W. Weeks of Massachusetts and Albert B. Fall of New Mexico. His friendship with Weeks is of longer standing than with Fall and probably more potent. It is remembered that before the convention of 1916, when Weeks was a candidate for the nomination for president, Mr. Harding on one occasion pointed him out to some friends and remarked:

"There is my idea of the kind of man that would make the best president."

Another of the best friends of Mr. Harding is Senator George Sutherland of Utah, one of the ablest constitutional lawyers of the country. It is an open secret that Sutherland could have had almost any place in the cabinet. The current rumor is that he preferred to continue his practice for a time, in which he is earning a large income, and that later on he is likely to be named on the Supreme court.

It may occasion some surprise that Will H. Hays, the new postmaster general, is not listed in the close friends. Those in best position to know say that Hays was taken into the cabinet circle from a sense of political fitness, as he was chairman of the national committee, and that he is not yet, at least, one of the inner circle. Mr. Harding thinks highly of the Hays political judgment and believes he will be useful in that regard.

Then there are the golfing companions, prominent among them Senator Prellinghuysen of New Jersey, Senator Hale of Maine and ex-Senator Bourne of Oregon. Prellinghuysen seems to have the longest reach of any in this presidential foursome, and their actual plum-pulling power is a subject of contention among the onlookers, some of whom believe that there are few plum trees around the links.

OTHERS ON LIST
Mr. Bourne, who also played golf with Taft and Wilson, is quoted as saying that Harding is a better hand with the stick than either of his predecessors. He makes 18 holes in about 90, while Wilson usually takes nearly 100 and Taft still more.

Senator Harry S. New of Indiana is another good friend of Mr. Harding and should not be left out of the picture. His political advice is said to be highly regarded by the new president. Alvin T. Hart of Kentucky is another visitor always welcomed. So is Editor George Harvey, and so is Henry P. Fletcher, former ambassador to Mexico, and under secretary of state. Congressman Charles F. Reaves of Newberg, next to "Nick" Longworth, is considered one of Mr. Harding's closest friends in the house.
