By George Bertz. PORTLAND baseball fans will have their first opportunity to judge the strength of Portland's baseball team Tuesday afternoon on the Vaughn street grounds when the Beavers face the Salt Lake Bees in the opening contest of a seven game series.

The Mackmen are coming home with the poorest record of any club since the McCredies took over the holdings in 1904. On only one other occasion did a Portland team fare worse and that was in 1903 when they won but two games out of three weeks' play.

PITCHING WEEK. This year's aggregation has displayed more power and deftness of strength than did the 1920 aggregation, but the pitching has been the poorest in several seasons.
