

CITY TO ASK BIDS FOR BULL RINK AT BULL RAIN PARK

The city of Portland will advertise Friday for proposals for construction of the new headquarters at Bull Run, and bids thereon will be opened May 2.

This will include three separate contracts and materials which the city will purchase direct. The main contract will be in the neighborhood of \$200,000.

The concrete dam proposed will have about 800,000 cubic feet of concrete in height and 160 feet long. This dam must be constructed during the low-water stage, whenever that may be during the summer months, and the contractors must be prepared with full equipment of concrete-mixers, etc., to rush work at once when this low-water stage is reached.

The other work of constructing a screen house and power plant is not, of course, dependent on the water stage, but is desired to have all finished at the earliest possible time. The contract time limit will be November 15. A penalty clause of \$50 per day for all work done beyond this date will be in the contract and it will also contain a clause providing for the city's paying a bonus of \$50 a day for each day that the contract is fully completed 30 days prior to that date.

Major Littlefield. Newberg, Or., April 21.—Accompanied with full military and Masonic honors, the funeral of the late Major Harry A. Littlefield, a prominent Newberg physician and surgeon, was conducted from his home in this city this afternoon.

For 25 years he had been identified with every progressive movement in Newberg, whose citizens paid his memory honor by suspension of business.

Following the service, conducted by Rev. J. W. Bowersox of the Evangelical church of Woodport, the body was conveyed on army caissons by a detachment of the Leavenworth post, American Legion, to the grave. The local Masonic body led the funeral procession and had charge of the final services.

Major Littlefield was born April 11, 1875, at Lafayette, Or., and was the son of the late Dr. H. R. Littlefield, who also spent a life of service in Yamhill county.

After graduating in the class of '96 at the University of Oregon medical school he enlisted and served in the Philippines during the Spanish-American war. During the late world war he volunteered, and upon arriving in France, was made commanding surgeon of the Sixth United States engineers with which unit he served until the signing of the armistice.

Dr. Littlefield is survived by his brother, Judge E. V. Littlefield of Portland.
