

PUBLIC ENTITLED TO LOWER MEATS

Retailers are today buying veal and hogs at much lower prices, and while as yet there has been little or no change in retail values, the public is about to be handed some of the benefits by down-town markets.

Veals have not been so low in price for many months and retailers are stocked heavily with such offerings. Consumers are entitled to secure their wants at reductions and special sales may therefore be expected.

Hog prices are dropping fast and retailers are expected to follow this trend of wholesale values. Some try to get out of this by claiming that wholesale prices are not down, but this is false. All over the country similar reductions in wholesale prices are shown.

Some of the packers are charging extreme prices for hams and bacon of the better quality, but the public refuses to buy, as there is no justification whatever for the prices asked. Provisions have not dropped along with the lower price of live hogs, land alone being an exception. The low price of

lard is due to the cheapness of cottonseed products.

Wards to Adopt Orphan
Salem, Or., April 22.—The boys of the state training school have subscribed \$50

with which to adopt the first of 500 Chinese-Near East relief orphans allotted to Marion county. Some of the boys who worked on ranches in Marion county last summer subscribed as much as \$15, while others contributed sums ranging from \$5 to \$25.
