The denomination jumped from 15.882 members to 17,139. Actual accessions were 1668 by examination and 1450 by certificate, but the net gain was 1257. in the Sunday schools, \$18,340 in benevolences and \$37,282 in congregational expenses. The total given to benevolences was \$89,911 and to general expenses,

Churches in the Portland presbytery added 878 members by examination and 721 by certificate and made a net gain of 990.
