Three Crossings In Baker Is Give

Salem, Or., May 13.—An order issued by the public service commission this morning authorizes the state highway commission to construct two overcrossings and one undercrossing at points en route of the Old Oregon Trail in Polk county.

One of the overcrossings is to be located at Unity, the estimated cost being \$18,000. The undercrossing at Durkee is estimated to cost \$15,000. At Huntington the authorized construction involves a combined bridge over Burnt river and

overcrossing over the railroad tracks a total cost of approximately \$41.5. Cost of the improvements is to be divided 40 per cent to the state highway commission, 40 per cent to the railroad company and 20 per cent to Bak
