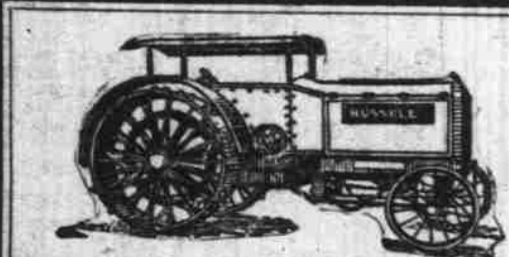

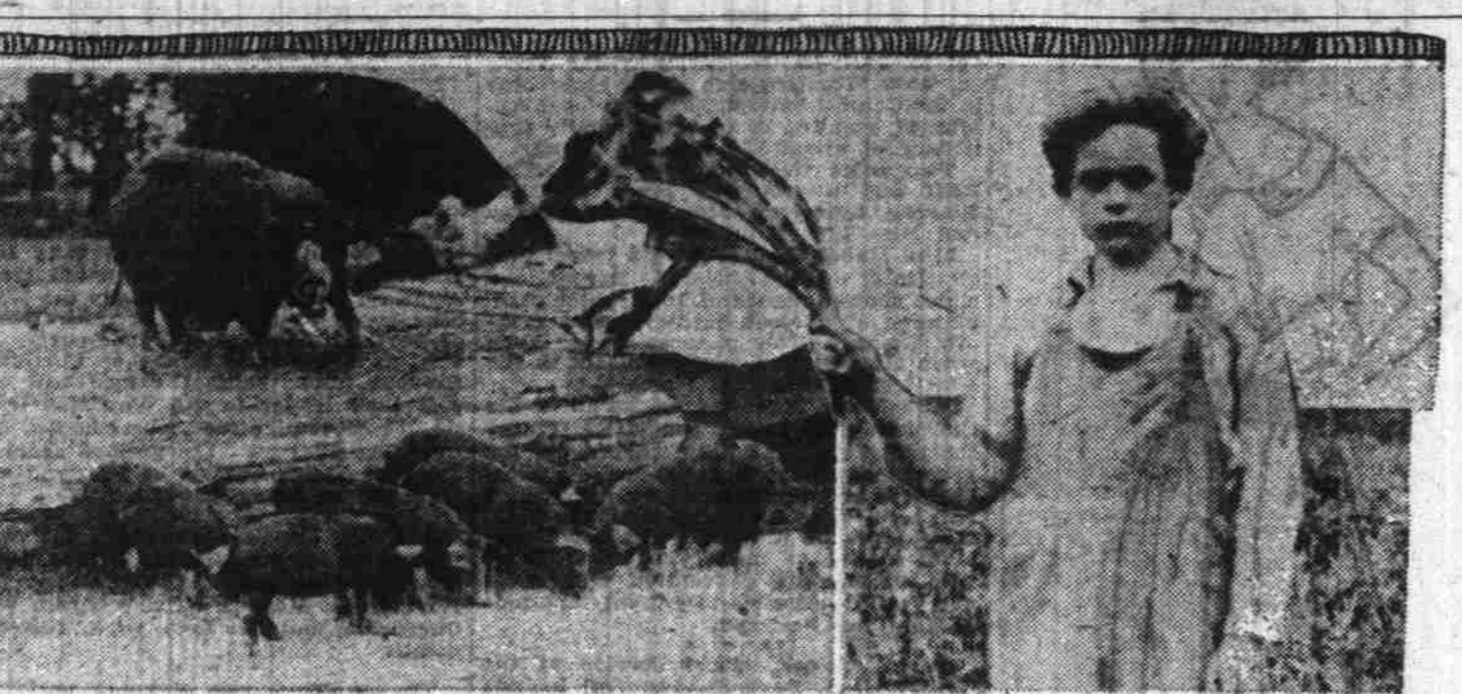

Arrangements have been made to store this year's crop in the only licensed wool warehouse in Oregon, that of the Western Wool Warehouse association.

Besides the actual marketing of the wool, the association is doing a whole lot in an educational way. It has issued instructions in the proper binding of fleeces with the right kind of twine.

The twine which it is furnishing is four ply paper twine used for fleeco binding in Australia. The regulation wool mohair sacks are also being used.

The wool growers will without doubt have one of the strongest cooperative marketing associations in the state.

"Unless we can readjust our railroad rates we will have to re-write the whole agricultural geography of the United States," declared Secretary of Commerce Herbert C. Hoover before the executive committee of the American Farm Bureau Federation in Washington recently.

"Our present rates will soon move our granaries to foreign shores, for today it costs 30 cents per bushel to ship grain from Missouri to New York and the same amount can be shipped by water from Argentina for 10 cents.

"We cannot afford to protect our foreign commerce without giving attention step by step to the development and production of our agriculture. I wish to express my approval of the excellent work which the American Farm Bureau federation is doing.

Results obtained from the experimental plots here and at the branch stations at Lind and Waterville, covering a number of years, were compiled in the preparation of this bulletin. Medium early seedling rather than early or late seedling are recommended. No advantage was found in the introduction of seed from other states or districts.

"The bulletin is ready for free distribution to farmers of the state, and may be had by writing to Dean E. C. Johnson, director of the Pullman experiment station.

Tomato plants in Danger of Injury in Being Transplanted
Tomato plants, after being transplanted to the garden are subjected to various things that cause them to be handicapped in their growth...

"The plants are also subject to injury by two insects, which can readily be controlled. The cutworm can be checked by the placing of a poisoned bran mash around the plants, and the flea beetle by dusting the plants with powdered arsenate of lead or the "one-in-all" dust.

GUERNSEY BUYER PRAISES OREGON

Practical tribute was paid to the healthful natural conditions of the Pacific Northwest, and to the system of both federal and state inspection used in Washington and Oregon, when the Adohr farm, near Los Angeles, sent its official veterinary, Dr. Maynard Rosenburger, to the Northwest to purchase 500 grade Guernseys to be added to its herd of 600 of the same breed last month.

"I found the dairy cattle so rugged and so generally satisfactory here," said Rosenburger, "that I wired my recommendation that more be purchased, despite the heavy expense of shipping them nearly 3,000 miles. I was told to go ahead, and I thought within the next week to ship my third carload. My greatest difficulty has been to get the owners of the cows selected to let me go."

SMALL FRUITS TO SHOW GOOD YIELD

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, May 21.—"Prospects for good crops of small fruits are fine," said W. S. Brown, professor of horticulture at the college.

Rosenburger expressed himself as astonished at the great ruggedness and vitality of the northwest herds he has visited, and said after observing the herds of Southern California, where statistics show an appalling average of tuberculosis and other maladies, by contrast the herds of Oregon and Washington, with the tuberculosis average percentages running as low as 2 per cent, no intelligent man could doubt the wisdom and practicability of the double inspection system.

GUERNSEY DEMAND HEAVY

"There is a marked demand for good Guernseys in both the grade and purebred, and it has taken me some time to make up my shipment. I obtained one car in the Willamette valley section, shipping it out of Shaw, and the other was made up largely of Clackamas county cows, shipped out of Oregon City."

The remarkable ruggedness and vitality of the animals, however, he believes due to natural conditions prevailing in Oregon, Washington and extreme Northern California. This section, he predicts, will inevitably become the great leading livestock section of the entire continent.

The Adohr farm has one of the largest herds in California, and supplies certified milk to the Hollywood and neighboring section of Los Angeles. Many famous movie stars are among the patrons of the Adohr farm, the de luxe product being much in demand.

GROWER'S ASSOCIATION NOTES

The Southern states are taking to Oregon prunes. The Oregon Growers' Cooperative association shipped this past week a carload to New Orleans and also filled an order for shipment to Yuma, Ariz.

Private reports to the Oregon growers are that the pear crop in California will average only about 60 per cent of a crop and that the prune crop will hardly come up to 70 per cent of a crop.

It pays to advertise. The California Associated Raisin company has just completed a campaign for membership, signing up 92 per cent of the raisin growers for 15 years. Now it is preparing to spend \$1,200,000 on an advertising campaign.

Efforts are being made by the fruit growing interests of the Northwest to have additional steamers put on for service between Portland and the Atlantic coast and also European ports for the carrying of fruit with proper refrigeration. It is stated that in order to make Portland the great fruit shipping port of the Northwest, the building of cold storage warehouses will be necessary in Portland.

MARKET EXPERT TO GIVE ADDRESS

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, May 21.—Colonel Harris Weinstein, formerly state marketing director of California, will be one of the speakers for farmers' week, June 12 to 18. His subject will be cooperative marketing.

Colonel Weinstein is said to have done more than any other man on the Pacific coast to make cooperative marketing a success. He has been active in the interest of agriculture in California since 1888. His first position of importance was on the California state board of horticulture. In 1913 President Wilson made him a member of the American commission to investigate the European system of rural credit.

Along with the colonel's lectures there will be special lectures on law relative to cooperative marketing organizations and special lectures dealing with organization problems.

Clatsop to Have Two Demonstration Farms for Poultry

Astoria, Or., May 21.—Two poultry demonstration farms will be established in Clatsop county, according to the plans made at a recent conference between H. W. McMinden, county agricultural agent, and H. E. Cosby, extension poultry specialist of the agricultural college. One of these demonstration farms will be on the Clatsop plains, and the other somewhere in the Fernhill, Stevenson, Knappa district. The exact location of farms will be made after a series of four culling demonstrations are held in the county in September.
