DAY WILL RECALL TENDER THOUGHTS OF SOLDIER DEAD

As a tribute to the Americans who have given their lives that liberty and freedom might live in this land, and that every man might be permitted to worship God according to the dictates of his own conscience, Memorial Sunday will be observed tomorrow in the churches of Portland.

Civil war, Spanish-American war and World War veterans' organizations in various sections of the city plan to attend some central church in a body, where in some cases their members will take a prominent part in the program. Flowers used to decorate the churches on Sunday during the memorial services will be laid on the graves of the departed soldiers in the afternoon on Monday.
