EPISCOPAL CLERGY OF EAST IS COMING TO LOCAL SESSION

Eastern clergymen of the Episcopal church are coming West for the sixth annual session of the Oregon summer school for Episcopal clergymen, which will be held from Monday to Friday in St. Helens Hall, Vista and Park avenues.

The object of the school is to unite the clergy of the Pacific diocese for conference and fellowship in the common cause of making the church stronger and more effective. The meetings are held at St. Helens hall through the courtesy of the Sisters of St. John Baptist, where meals and lodging will be furnished visiting clergymen.

The annual business meeting will be Thursday evening and the main social function will be a trip over the Columbia river highway on Thursday afternoon.

The evening lectures given by Dr. Lester Bradner of New York will be open to the public, especially those engaged in church school work.

No charge will be made for the course. A round table conference will follow each evening lecture, when matters relating to church school work will be discussed.

The school will begin Monday at 8 p. m. with a lecture on "The Church's Program for Parochial Education."

The committee in charge of the school are the Rev. Thomas Jenkins, president; Rev. E. T. Hicks, secretary; Olympia; the Rev. Edgar M. Rogers of Treasurer; and the Rev. George H. Severance of Spokane.
