

COOLIDGE SPEAKS AT UNVEILING OF HARDING'S BUST

Address Delivered in Shadow of
Memorial to McKinley, to Whose
Memory He Pays High Tribute

Niles, Ohio, June 18.—(U. S. S.)—Speaking in the shadow of the memorial to William McKinley at his birthplace today, Vice President Calvin Coolidge paid high tribute to the memory of the martyred president and to the work and character of his present successor, President Warren G. Harding when a bust of the president was unveiled here.

"He was wiser than his critics," said the vice president, in speaking of President McKinley. "He was gentler than his friends. He was firmer than his party."

PRaises President
After reviewing his life and works the speaker then turned to a discussion of present day problems and the work of his chief.

"Nations do not stand still," he declared. "They advance or they recede. America goes forward. It would have been in vain that this monument was built to a great son of Ohio if he were to have no successor to take up and carry on the ever-unfinished task of serving the world most by serving America best."

The foundation of all that President Harding is was laid in Ohio, the speaker said. "Here he has been a dutiful son, a loyal and helpful brother, an affectionate husband, a kind neighbor and always a Christian gentleman."

Holds Rational Line
"President Harding leans neither to the reactionary line nor to the revolutionary; he holds to the rational line. He will not only support all truly humanitarian progress, but will go forward on the firm foundation of realities."

The world needs patience, pacification and harmony under righteousness. Let us hallow the memory of him who so greatly desired these in the past by supporting the leadership of him who is so effectively establishing them in the present."

made little progress toward a solution, and here it is almost midsummer, when the whole thing was to have been passed and out of the way.

The language in the tariff are local in their effect and no one doubts that discontent over certain proposed schedules is causing considerable political ruction.

The insurgency of the Minnesota Republicans, who protest against the Fawcett tariff on lumber, is only the forerunner of a series of similar "between sections of the country as well as opposing interests in the manufacturing and banking world."

Thus far President Harding has kept out of the general run of controversies in the tariff, but people on Capitol Hill believe he will sooner or later have to take a hand and steer the ship. Mr. Harding already has made it plain that he will insist only on the tariff on measures like a new department of public welfare or a government reorganization bill put through; he realizes precedence must be given to the tariff and taxes, even though nothing else is done on other bills.

HARDING IS CAUTIOUS
Mr. Harding is trying not to force congress. He is loath to do anything that might seem to be dictation either in a Wilsonian or Rooseveltian sense. He would prefer that congress function under its own leadership.

But even the leaders in congress are not altogether sure that it is a good plan. They do not, of course, want to be forced to do things against their better judgment; they do not like to be ordered to pass a bill when there is a powerful sentiment inside the party against it, but when the whole situation is more or less in confusion and members are pressing consideration of their own bills as against administrative measures, it is helpful for the leaders to get a word of counsel from the chief executive.

FLORENCE LEEDS MAY APPEAR FOR STILLMAN'S WIFE

Former Century Roof Beauty Has
Broken With Banker, Despite
\$500,000 Gift, It Is Asserted.

New York, June 18.—Florence Leeds, former Century Roof beauty, who has broken with James A. Stillman, may appear as one of Mrs. Stillman's principal witnesses in her divorce suit defense, according to information available here today.

Inflamed with jealousy, it is reported, Mrs. Leeds is bitterly anxious to do all in her power against the man with whom she is said to have lived for years.

The cause of the break between Stillman and Mrs. Leeds was an "affair" disclosed by the newspapers between Stillman and a woman in high society. The former chorus girl is said to be determined that Stillman shall be reported in jail for his alleged philandering.

\$500,000 SETTLEMENT REPORTED
It is said that Stillman has settled \$500,000 on the former Century Roof girl. In addition he is said to have agreed to provide for and educate the baby, Jay Ward Leeds. The child is to remain in the custody of Mrs. Leeds.

Another development today was the reported return to New York of "Clara," a scandalous woman named by Mrs. Stillman in her reply to the banker's charges. According to the report, correspondent No. 2 came back to her former haunts yesterday. She was reported as assuming a fictitious name and lodging somewhere in the Forties.

This woman, a blonde and of Scandinavian descent, hurriedly left apartments at 242 West Forty-ninth street some time ago when her name was brought into the case. She left vague reports that she was bound for Minnesota.

50 OR MORE WITNESSES
Although Mrs. Leeds' appearance and that of "Clara" would be highly important to the case of Mrs. Stillman, it is known that if they appear they will be but two of 50 or more witnesses for the defense.

The state witnesses will include people from every walk of life—guides from the Canadian woods, farmers from Iowa, men high in the world of industry. "One of the most important witnesses, it is said, will be a sailor who has served on Stillman's palatial yacht, the 'Modesty,' and who was a witness to one of the former banker's alleged amours."

Mrs. Orthwein to Give Own Story of Shooting on Stand

Chicago, June 18.—(U. P.)—Attorneys for Mrs. Cora Orthwein, charged with the murder of Herbert P. Ziegler, will ask the court to throw the murder case out of court, it was announced here tonight.

"All the state's witnesses have been our best evidence," said Ben Short, Mrs. Orthwein's lawyer. "There is no use going on. I will appeal to the court Monday."

The state rested its case late today and the defense will start Monday unless the judge grants the request of Short. "I am confident that I will be acquitted," said Mrs. Orthwein tonight. "The state's trump cards were jokers."

The state has been attempting to prove that Mrs. Orthwein killed Ziegler because she was jealous of another woman. Mrs. Orthwein said she did it in self-defense.

The defendant plans to take the stand and tell her story.

Fruit Shippers of Coast to Be Heard On High Rail Rates

Washington, June 18.—(U. P.)—The interstate commerce commission today ordered reopened the case of the Pacific coast fruit and vegetable shippers against the high transcontinental freight rates.

The case was ordered for rehearing to give the shippers on the coast an opportunity to show why the general increase in freight rates is unjust insofar as the shipment of perishable commodities is concerned and because of present conditions.

A former petition for the reopening of the complaint of the shippers against the high rates has been refused by the commission. No date was set for a formal hearing on the question.

Cash Bonus Opposed By U. S. Chamber of Commerce Leaders

Washington, June 18.—(U. P.)—The United States Chamber of Commerce tonight came out against a cash bonus for service men.

A brief sent to President Harding by hundreds of trade and commercial organizations declared the war had laid a mortgage of \$115 on every family in the United States, and that a cash bonus would only add to the burden.

At the same time the brief made it clear that the organization is actively in favor of "national legislation to meet adequately the needs of hospitalization and rehabilitation for disabled veterans and for constructive measures to enable ex-service men to cultivate the soil, to build homes or to obtain vocational training."

Discuss Final Plan To Connect Great Lakes and Ocean

Ottawa, Ont., June 18.—(U. P.)—Final plans for the deep waterway project which will provide Great Lakes shipping with an outlet to the sea, were discussed here today.

Colonel P. F. Wooten, United States engineer, and W. A. Lowden, chief engineer of railways and canals for Canada, conferred on revision of the joint engineering features of the project. The completed plans will be presented to the joint international commission next week.

After receipt of the engineers' report the commission will have three months in which to decide on the economic feasibility of the undertaking.

The project, which would permit freighters from all lake ports to reach tidewater at low tonnage costs, calls for a reduction in the existing number of locks by concentrating the development into four or five locks along the St. Lawrence river from Cardinal to Montreal. That would involve the flooding of adjacent country and consequent payment of enormous damages. The cost is estimated at \$100,000,000.
