he, too, was arrested by the United States marshal Monday afternoon and lodged in the county jail in default of \$1500 bond. Assistant United States Attorney Flegel says the rooms where Ng Wei lived at 99 North Fourth street were headquarters for Harry Chin, Willie Wong and Ah Wee, defendants who have recently been sent to jail by the government. When Ng was arrested he had two one quarter drams of morphine in his possession. Flegel said Ng had been peddling drugs in the city for about one month.
