

SNAP IN FISH IS OFFERED IN TRADE

Red snapper fish is considered one of the ocean's best offerings but in a special drive to get the public here more generally acquainted with the offerings, sales are being made as low as 5 cents a pound for this week. There is no profit whatever at this price-but retailers say they are trying to stimulate the demand for the deep sea product.

Fresh salmon is in somewhat better supply locally but most of the stock is imported from outside the state. Very little Columbia river product is available.

There is plenty of halibut available and liberal stocks of shad are offering. For the latter there is little demand as the general public has not yet awakened to the fact that they are missing something. Chickens are higher in the retail market because of a scarcity and advanced quotations at wholesale.

Eggs are inclined to sell a trifle lower in some downtown markets. This is following the wholesale decline. The Yamhill market quoted a rise of 2c.

Pie cherries are now at their best and if the public wants quality and at the right price, now is the time to buy.

Strawberries are now so low that growers debate whether to gather them. Quality is not quite as good as it was a week ago, but it will not be better this season.

Raspberries are selling slightly lower but next week will be the time to can both raspberries and loganberries.

This is the time to purchase cherries as they are at their lowest points for the season.

Wholesale prices on meats have been generally reduced recently but retail butchers are making no change whatever. There is more or less talk among some producers of inducing the public to cooperate in the selling of meats and thereby secure their requirements at lower prices than private dealers are forcing the public to pay.
