

FRUITS ARE CHEAP IN RETAIL SHOPS

Consumers who do not secure their strawberries at once are doomed to be disappointed for there is no likelihood of any material offerings after next week so far as canning operations are concerned. While strawberries are available in the market for a number of months each season there are but three weeks or so during that period when stock is at its best and prices favorable to the consumer.

The low prices on strawberries this season have proved very attractive to the consumer for, despite all reports to the contrary, sales to the public have been the heaviest known.

Loganberries and raspberries are likely to be at their best next week, therefore consumers should get rid of their strawberry requirements at once.

Then cherries are available in large supply for canning. Royal Ann stock is the lowest price for many a year and Bing is moderately priced too. Lamberts are just making their appearance from some of the earlier producing sections and the crop in the immediate vicinity of Portland will soon be available.

Apricots promise a small crop in nearby sections and this is likely to be one crop that will not drop to the extreme low price of other commodities. The same is true as regards peaches. The Pacific Northwest crop this season is short.

New Oregon apples that make the average boy open his eyes are being offered and within a short time will become plentiful.

Watermelons are slightly lower in price at 6 cents a pound and the quality is excellent.

Cantaloupes are plentiful but consumers must take care in purchasing because only perhaps one carload out of 10 is ripe enough to eat. The good stock smells right while the green stuff has a musty smell.
