

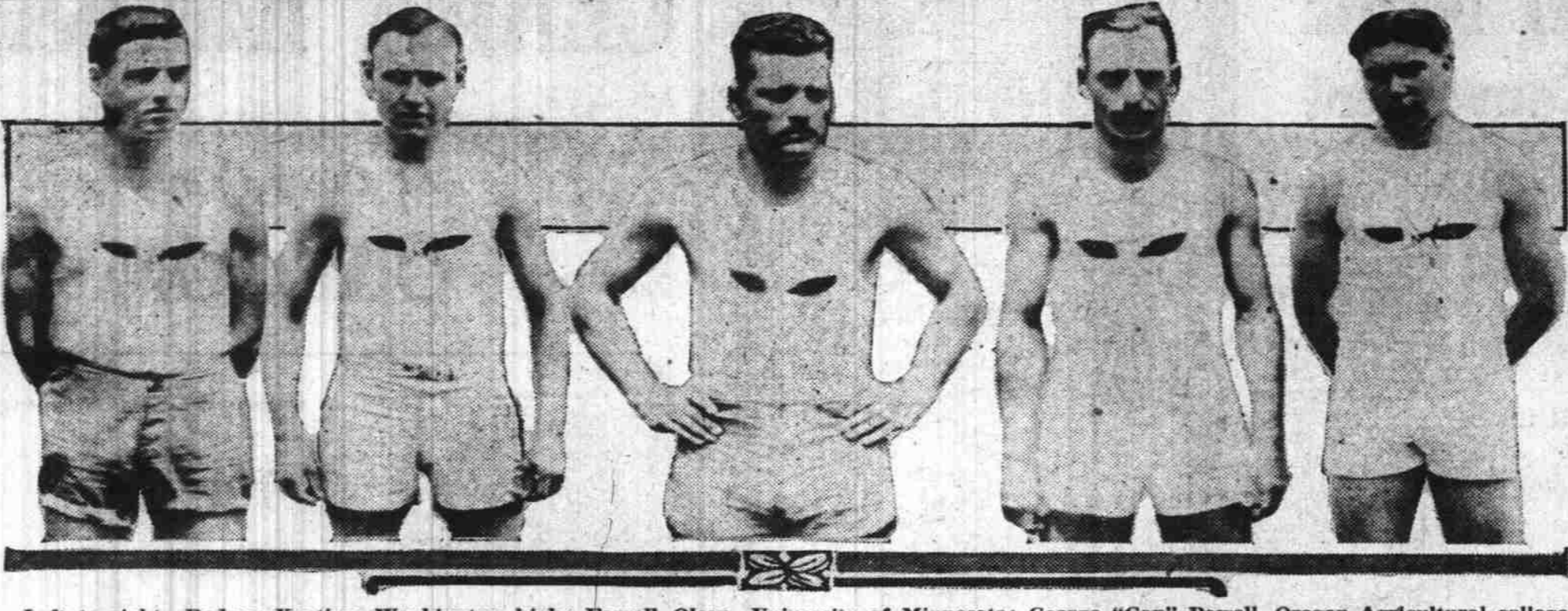
Semi-Finals In Golf Play On Tap Today
