New York, June 25.—(I. N. S.)—The stock market closed strong today, nearly all the leading issues moving up to new high levels for the day in the last few minutes.

U. S. Steel sold up to 78 1/2 and Baldwin rose to 69 1/2, a gain of over 4 points. Metallum moved up to 117 1/2 and General Asphalt to 54. Chandler Motors, after being bought by the market, advanced 2 points to 72 while Reading rose 2 1/2.

Government bonds unchanged; railway and other bonds steady. The stock market displayed a buoyant tone at the opening today, initial prices ranging from fractions to over 2 points above last night's closing levels.
