

## FORMER RESIDENTS OF SALEM TO GIVE PICNIC SATURDAY

The Salem picnic, an annual event of much interest to the large number of former residents of Salem now located in Portland and vicinity, will be held this year at Laurelhurst park Saturday, July 16.

J. D. Lee, elected president of the society at its meeting last year, is now busy getting in touch with his various committees and will announce the program for the day within the near future.

The Salem picnic was instituted as a permanent annual event several years ago when a small number of former Salem residents gathered at the Oaks to renew old acquaintances and talk over old times. The initial gathering was such a success that officers were elected and the date set for the next annual gathering.

A general announcement of the meeting published a few days prior to its date resulted in the assembling of close to a thousand former residents of the capital city, since which time the event has been awaited with a good deal of interest by those who attend while it has become the custom for quite a number of Salem residents to make the trip from that city each time in order to meet with former neighbors and friends.

President Lee announces that an interesting program will be arranged for this year's gathering. All former or present residents of Salem are urged by him to attend the picnic. The reception committee will be on hand at Laurelhurst park at 1 o'clock. The program will be given shortly before 3 o'clock, which hour has been set as the time for the basket luncheon to be opened, for it is an old time pioneer affair where good things to eat play an important part in the afternoon's festivities.

Corvallis, July 7.—Two houses were burned to the ground Sunday when the roofs caught fire from sparks from the chimney. The house of Joe Bryant, two miles north of the city, on the main highway, was destroyed before firemen could give assistance. Some of the furniture and the out buildings were saved. The W. Hammer house on the Philomath road, with the garage, feed warehouse, carpenter shop, and a part of a pear orchard, was destroyed. An auto was taken from the garage before the flames reached it. The awning of a local confectionery and lunch room was burned Monday when it caught fire from fire crackers.
