

FAGAN KILLING IS JUSTIFIED; JURY RENDERS VERDICT

Hood River, Or., July 8.—In a crowded courtroom Thursday, Coroner J. W. Sifton conducted an inquest over the body of Luther Fagan, desperado and ex-convict, who Wednesday, after shooting T. F. Miller, Belmont rancher, abducted Miller's wife, daughter and adopted son and held them for seven hours as hostages for his own protection against posers, and was shot and killed by Herman Pregge, a local noted rifle-man, after Fagan had repeatedly stated he would kill the two women at sundown.

Among those who testified were Mrs. Miller, who appeared to be suffering from her terrible experiences; Herman Pregge, who shot Fagan, and Marshal Bill Hart and W. Walters, who played prominent parts in pleading with the desperado for the lives of the women.

The jury returned a verdict of justifiable homicide, exonerating members of the posse, without mentioning Pregge's name, and declaring that Fagan met his death while defying law and order and threatening to murder Mrs. Miller and her daughter. Fagan's body will be buried by the county today unless relatives appear to claim it, which is considered unlikely.

Miss Pearl Miller, confined to her home, suffering from shock, but it is thought that she and her father will recover.

It was rumored that Fagan had a man accompany her, endeavoring to learn the whereabouts of Miss Louise Watkins, and a close watch is being maintained for him. Miss Watkins, a step-daughter of Miller, caused Fagan's arrest at the time he was sent to the penitentiary and Fagan was seeking her for revenge when he appeared at the Miller farm Wednesday.

'Out of Poorhouses By Christmas,' New Slogan of Legion

Washington, July 8.—"Out of the poor houses by Christmas." This is the slogan adopted by the national hospitalization and vocational training committee of the American Legion, as a result of Secretary of the Treasury Mellon's approval of the program for immediate expenditure of \$18,000,000 for new government hospitals.

The committee, at a meeting Thursday night, adopted resolutions thanking Secretary Mellon for approving the program, and at the same time attempted to lay the foundation for another appropriation.

The committee believes that when the present building program is completed at least \$16,000,000 more will be needed for more than 5000 hospital beds.

Whites in Yokohama Ask Protection From Japanese Criminals

Yokohama, July 8.—Because of the increasing boldness of Japanese criminals here, who seemed to have singled out the white population as their special prey, the Yokohama foreign board of trade, composed of American and European business men and agents of importing and exporting firms, today asked the authorities of the city for better police protection.

The request is a direct result of the stabbing to death last night of Ronald Hall, a British subject, who was murdered when he awoke and found a Japanese burglar in his home. Hall's mother was also seriously stabbed.

Four yards of cloth, four iron spades, 12 pounds of petroleum or 12 boxes of matches.

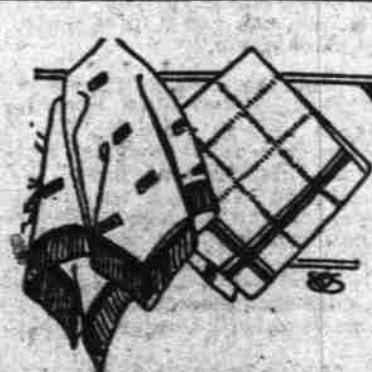
