The fourteenth annual meeting of the Baptist convention was held at Des Moines June 15 to 22.

For several days preceding the convention, preliminary meetings were held. These were the Pastors' conference, the Evangelistic conference and the Fundamentals conference.

The convention was called to order by President E. L. Tustin. Words of welcome were spoken by Governor Kendall of Iowa and Mayor H. H. Barton of Des Moines.

An excellent report on "Our Denominational Schools" was read by Dr. Goodrich of New York.
