

# GRAND CIRCLE OF WOODCRAFT HOPES TO CLOSE TODAY

With extra sessions Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights of this week the neighbors of Woodcraft expect to close the grand circle and take trains out of Portland Thursday night and Friday morning.

Some important matters were still to be settled when the grand circle adjourned Wednesday evening until Thursday morning at 10 o'clock.

It has been decided that the home for aged and infirm members at Riverside, Cal., shall be sustained by a levy of 10 cents a month on every member. This will yield between \$700 and \$400 a month, with augmenting amount as the order increases in numerical strength. The deficit in the general fund is to be made up with three extra half assessments this year, collected for three months consecutively. The invested funds of the order in the benefit funds now amount to over \$2,250,000 and at the present rate of increasing will be over \$3,500,000 before 1922, it is estimated. The grand circle met Monday, July 11, at the call of Mrs. C. C. Van Orsdahl, grand guardian, who was shortly followed by wards taken ill and has been confined to her bed during the entire time. Mrs. Minnie Hiner, grand adviser, has had the trying ordeal of presiding over the sessions in the large hall of the Neighbors of Woodcraft building at Tenth and Taylor streets, and her labors have been appreciated by the officers and delegates to the number of 175 in attendance from the nine states of the Pacific coast.

## Now Is Time to See Venus in All Her Brilliance

Amateur astronomers who do not mind knocking the sleep from their eyes before dawn are enjoying the splendor of Venus as it rises in the east about two hours before the sun comes up. Thursday morning it was described as glowing with unusual magnificence. It is light apparently keener than a full-orbed moon on a cloudless night. It is said to beam over the eastern heavens with all the aureole of sunrise. Students of astronomy explain that this is the seven year maximum brilliancy attained by the planet due to its minimum distance from the earth. The planet is slowly receding from the earth and in a few months will offer nothing unusual.

## STATE LIBRARY'S MAIL SERVICE IS AID TO THOUSANDS

Salem, Or., July 21.—The people of Salem probably know less about the state library and its operations than residents of any other part of the state. Three hundred thousand persons in Oregon, living under "pioneer conditions" who have no other book source from which to draw, are dependent upon the state library—10,000 of whom are registered patrons who regularly use the mail service to obtain volumes and pay all postage themselves.

These were some of the figures quoted by Miss Cornelia Marvin, state librarian, when she addressed the Salem Rotary club at its regular weekly luncheon at the Marion hotel Wednesday. "The Oregon state library," Miss Marvin pointed out, "is undoubtedly one of the most active in the United States, due to the fact that in other states, with the possible exception of a few in the south, there are but comparatively few persons yet living under 'pioneer' conditions."

The Oregon library functions chiefly in two ways, Miss Marvin said. It first attempts to reach those readers who have no local library from which to draw and its second purpose is to perform supplementary work to those libraries of the state which are inadequate to the demands of its patrons. Most of the libraries of Oregon, she explained, with the exception of those in Multnomah county, are small and merely serve as clearing houses. Books of the "heavier" variety which these small libraries turn their readers are, for the most part, secured from the state library.

## Man Completes Hike From Los Angeles To N. Y. on Wager

Ferib Amboy, N. J., July 21.—(I. N. S.)—John Lutz, 21, expects to walk into his home at 142 Franklin avenue, the Bronx, N. Y., early tomorrow morning as the final stage in a 4000-mile hike from Los Angeles.

He reached here today, within one stage of the winning end of a \$600 stake put up by California naturalists. He has walked the entire distance, camping out most of the way, since April 24 and has eaten no meats or cooked foods on the trip. Neither has he shaved nor cut his hair.
