Ad Clubs Will Protest Newspaper Attacks on Cities

"Hereafter, when any Pacific coast newspaper prints an attack on a Pacific coast city it will receive at least a dozen telegrams of protest from Pacific Coast Advertising Clubs association, Rollin C. Ayres, president of the Pacific Coast Advertising clubs association, speaking before the Portland Ad club at the Benson Wednesday.

"We think such protests should be effective in promoting our campaign to cause all Pacific coast cities to pull together for a greater development and without inter-city prejudices, jealousy and bickerings," he explained.

Ayres awarded cups won by Portland at the recent Pacific coast advertising convention in Tacoma—to Hall & Emory for the best general exhibit; to the W. S. Kirkpatrick service for the best manufacturers' advertising display; to the better business bureau (a silver shield) for the best year's showing; to F. H.
