

DENIAL OF CLAIM OF BENSON SCHOOL IS EXPLAINED

Senator McNary Receives Copy of Decision of Vocational Board Attorney in Washington.

Washington, Aug. 6.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL).—A copy of the opinion rendered by D. J. Richardson, legal adviser of the federal vocational board, rejecting the claim for \$25,000 for the Benson polytechnic school presented by Director George E. Thomas of Portland school district, has been received by Senator McNary from Harry L. Fidler, acting director of the board. In his opinion, the statement of facts clearly shows that the claim of the Benson school is without merit. Prior to the purchase of the equipment for which reimbursement is now requested, Director Thomas was advised by the central office that it was impossible for the board to permit him to act for it in securing the equipment and furthermore it was mutually agreed by the officers of the board and Director Thomas that the attempt to equip part of the Benson school for use of the federal board trainees should be abandoned. "Consequently it must be assumed that equipment subsequently purchased by the director was for the general use of the school and this assumption in judgment is fully sustained by provisions of the proposed summer school contract later submitted."

The opinion asserts that the school is not a legal obligation; that while it is true \$25,000 was allotted to supply training facilities in the school district in 1920, this was by its terms a general allotment and made no reference to the Benson school. Director Thomas reported upon his return to Portland that he was virtually assured by the head of the rehabilitation division of the federal vocational board that the claims of the Benson Polytechnic school would be approved, when he visited Washington some two weeks ago and the decision of the legal adviser was received with surprise.

According to Director William F. Woodward, the claim was based on an agreement between the school board and the federal board to equip the school with machinery for vocational training during the summer months. He said the money had been apportioned and sent to Seattle, where it was diverted through other channels. He went on to say that on several occasions the board had been assured the money would be forthcoming only to be forestalled by "exasperating red tape and legal technicalities."

CANADA ASKS VOICE IN ARMS CONFERENCE

Representatives of the British dominions, that of course, is something to be hoped for in order that the problems affecting Canada, New Zealand and Australia in the Pacific may be better understood, but in the end the signature of Great Britain alone will be sought, as the United States does not maintain diplomatic relations with the various states of the British empire.

Even if the British delegation doesn't include representatives of the British dominions, the conference will from time to time hear arguments from any of the British states whose position might be affected.

MUST BE UNANIMOUS
Thus the Canadian premier was often given an audience in the Paris peace talks and was in frequent conference with President Wilson and the heads of the governments when matters vital to Canada were being considered. But, consultations with Canada, Australia or other British dominion representatives will be along the same line as conference with Holland or Belgium or other countries which have asked for an opportunity to be present when matters affecting them are discussed.

Secretary Hughes emphasized the fact that the powers invited to the conference are sovereign nations and that any agreements made by them must be unanimous.

In making the agenda or program for the conference the same rule will be followed. Incidentally, the United States probably will seek opinion from other powers as to the questions that would be included in the agenda and will make some suggestions of her own.

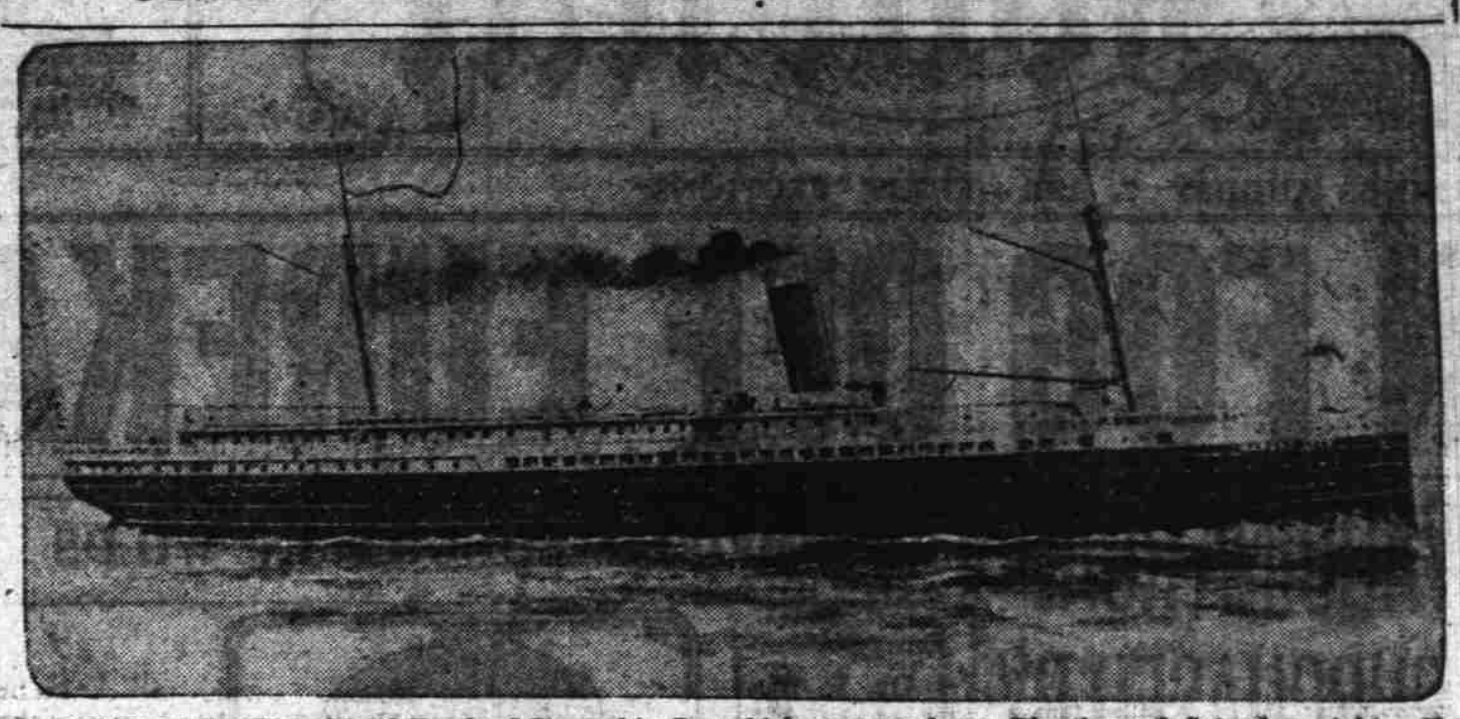
MAY SUGGEST ADDITIONS

All the diplomatic representatives of the various powers invited will be discussing the agenda informally for the next several weeks, but if the program is still incomplete, it can be finished after the conference actually begins.

Any power, moreover, will be privileged to suggest additions to the agenda even after the conference has begun, but unless all the powers agree to include the new subjects they must be excluded.

Father, in Despair, Pleads for Work to Support His Family

Merchant Is Killed When Train Hits Auto at Crabtree

Albany, Or., Aug. 6.—S. M. Wirt, Crabtree merchant, was fatally injured this morning at the Southern Pacific railway crossing in Crabtree when a freight train struck and demolished his automobile.

Wirt was driving a delivery car and it is believed that he became confused while attempting to shift gears. He was thrown from the car and the automobile was carried 70 feet. The train is said to have been proceeding at a moderate rate of speed.

The injured man was rushed to the Lebanon hospital, where it was found that he had suffered a crushed skull, five broken ribs and a broken collarbone. He died late this afternoon. His wife and five children survive. Mr. Wirt had been a resident of the Crabtree neighborhood for many years.

SEASIDE IS GAY IN SEAWALL FETE

Dedication of \$100,000 Structure Participated in by Thousands; Bathing Girl Parade Feature.

Seaside, Aug. 6.—Seaside today celebrated with eclat the dedication of its new \$100,000 sea wall and promenade, a project that has been under way for months and projected for years. Thousands of people participated in the first day of the two-day celebration, hundreds of Portland people, including city officials, Royal Rosarians and other organizations joining in the festivities.

The program included seaplane events over the breakers, following the bathing girl parade of the afternoon, which was a colorful and sprightly feature. Band and vocal concerts and congratulatory speeches were added events. Mayor Baker of Portland, Governor Ben W. Olcott, and Frank Branch Riley were among those to compliment Seaside upon its progressive spirit as exemplified by the completion of the great causeway.

The seawall is a mile and a half long and is topped by a broad promenade protected by a substantial guard railing. Below a great automobile turn-around at the end of the wall are rest rooms and comfort stations.

The program today will be a continuation of Saturday's events. Mayor E. N. Hurd of Seaside was chairman of the arrangements committee, and was felicitated upon the success of the opening celebration.

arrived at the scene, it was not known that the vessel had sunk—so dense was the fog.

Blunt's reef, on which the vessel struck, is one of the most dangerous points along the coast. Two lights warn ships of their danger and as they are visible 12 miles at sea, it is believed that disabled machinery must have driven the Alaska upon the jagged rocks which project from the reef.

Coastguards are rushing to the scene to assist in the work of rescue. The Alaska left Portland Friday at 11 a. m. and was due to reach this port Tuesday.

8. O. S. PROMPT
The Alaska hit the reef and promptly sent out S. O. S. signals. After giving her position and calling for immediate assistance, the Alaska's radio apparently failed as the land station was unable to read her further efforts to signal.

At 9:45 p. m. steamer Ernest H. Meyer was reached 10 miles north of San Francisco and directed to rush immediately to the assistance of the Alaska.

The steamer Anzax was located five miles south of the point at which the Alaska struck and is proceeding to the scene as rapidly as the fog will permit. It has not been learned whether the grounding of the ship was due entirely to the fog or was a result of the disabling of her machinery.

The vicinity of Blunt's reef is noted among mariners as a "graveyard of ships." Within a radius of 50 miles probably a score of ships have been wrecked in as many years.

OTHER WRECKED SHIPS
Notable among the vessels lost there have been the steamer Bear, owned by

the same company as operates the Alaska, which went ashore north of Cape Mendocino in 1916 with the loss of five lives.

The steamer St. Paul, the Norwegian freighter Tricolor, the Riverside, the Humbird and many others have gone down in the same region.

To the northward lies Humboldt bay, near the entrance to which the wreck of the United States cruiser Milwaukee still may be seen.

The Alaska is rated as a passenger steamer, 3709 tons gross and 2300 net tonnage. She is 327 feet long, 46 feet beam, 13.5 depth and carries a crew of 45. Her indicated horsepower is 4000. She was built in 1883 at Chester, Pa.; Port Townsend is her home port.

Her officers are: Captain Harry Hovey, Portland; First Officer William McClintock, purser, Edward Morgan, chief steward, Charles H. Dehane, chief engineer, J. F. Calhoun, Seattle.

The vessel carried a complement of 10 officers and a total crew of 80. The number of passengers on board was not known here.

Last of Soldier Dead Will Be in U. S. by October 1

Washington, Aug. 6.—(U. P.)—All bodies of our soldier dead will be returned from Europe by October 1, the war department estimated today. The work of bringing the remaining bodies from France is nearing completion rapidly, officials stated.
