Salem, Or., Aug. 13.—The state bonus commission, in session here Friday, voted to increase the first bond issue for bonus purposes from \$3,000,000, as agreed upon at a previous meeting, to \$5,000,000.

Rockaway, Or., Aug. 13.—William Kelly, 6-year-old son of George Kelly, motor policeman in Portland, fell from a raft in Seaview lake, where he was playing alone, and was near drowning when seen by D. R. Howell, Southern Pacific agent at Rockaway.

Father Accused of Kidnaping Daughter

Walla Walla, Wash., Aug. 13.—Complaint was filed in justice court here Friday charging O. L. Keel of Billings, Mont., with kidnaping his 10-year-old child, Roberta, by E. G. Shaw, husband of Keel's former wife.

Infant Drowns in Washington River

Astoria, Aug. 13.—Playing beside Grays River, the Washington stream upon which her parents live, Alice Olson, 19-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. Olson of Rosburg, Wash., fell into the water and was drowned without attracting the attention of her mother, who was nearby. The body was recovered two hours later.

Thrills Promised At Air Exhibition

Seaside, Aug. 13.—Thrills in abundance are promised the visitors to Seaside Sunday when aviators will stage an exhibition of airplane stunts. Two planes will be in action during the greater part of the afternoon and as a climax an exhibition of wing walking and a parachute jump from an elevation of 5000 feet will be made by I. J. OSBORNE TO FIGHT CASE

Salem, Or., Aug. 13.—E. G. Osborne of Portland, who pleaded not guilty to a charge of reckless driving, growing out of an automobile collision near Brooks, July 2, in which Rudolph Samuelson of Canby and Mrs. Roy Wesley of St. Johns were fatally injured, said that he will fight the case. Osborne asserts he was not speeding at the time and that, being on the main highway, he was entitled to right of way.

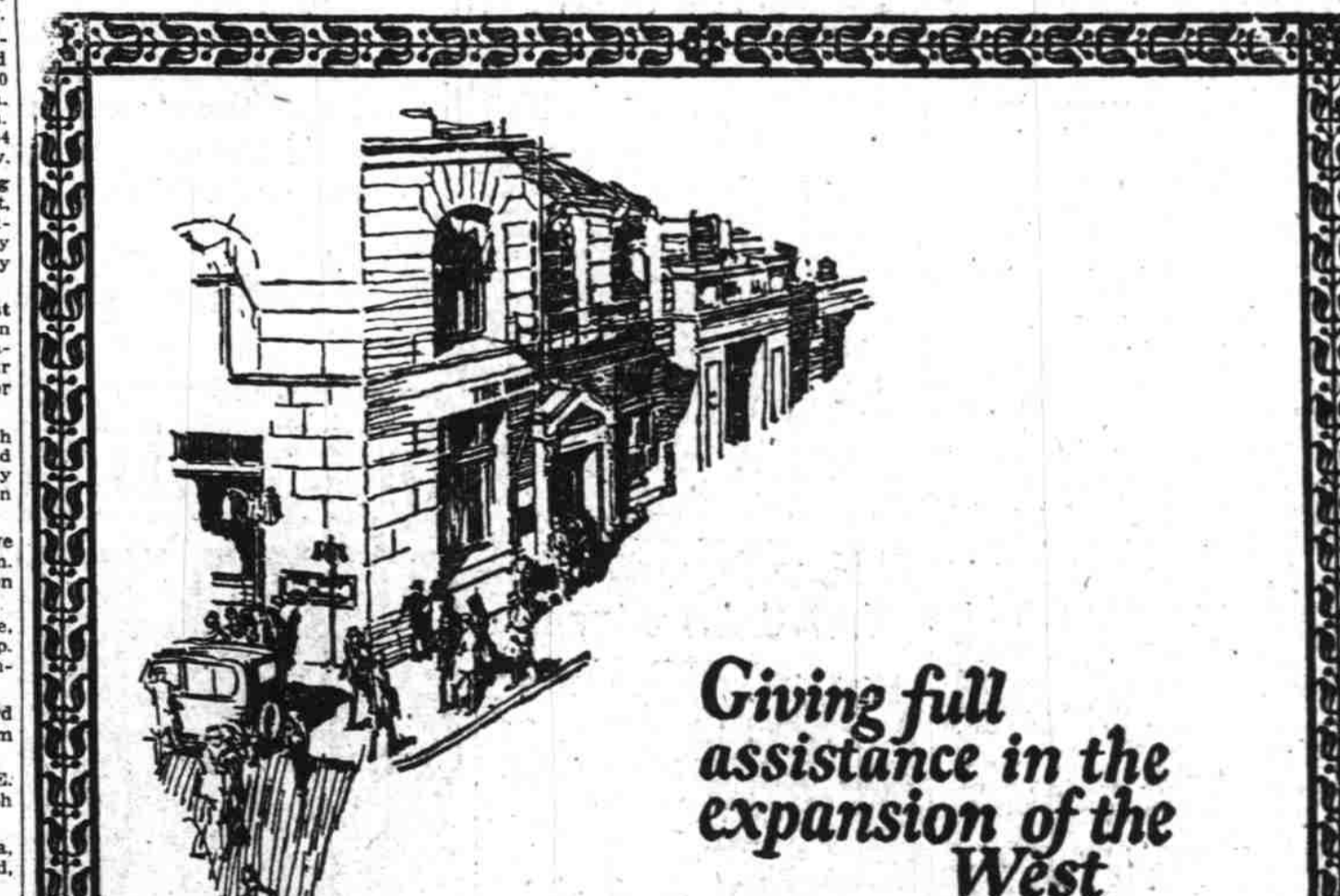
